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Explanations

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1. What action is required when a medication error occurs?

Also, limitations on sales to educational institutions are often not as broad as commercial or industrial purposes encompass, as these institutions would primarily need such substances for specific training or demonstration purposes rather than for general use.

C Buprenorphine or methadone for opioid replacement therapy - This is the correct use for faxing M3P prescriptions. A: Pain management - Faxing M3P prescriptions for pain management is not a recommended or common practice. These types of medications are typically prescribed in person and require closer monitoring by a healthcare provider. B: Antibiotics for infections - Faxing M3P prescriptions for antibiotics is not recommended as, in most cases, the patient would need to be seen by a healthcare provider for proper diagnosis and treatment. D: Emergency medications - Faxing M3P prescriptions for emergency medications is not recommended. In urgent situations, it is crucial for patients to be seen in person in order to receive prompt and appropriate treatment.
