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Explanations

Therefore, the most effective approach, especially for general brightness adjustments, is through the Exposure or Brightness/Contrast settings.

When the original reference file is unavailable, using the option to "Place Embedded" is an effective way to incorporate the needed content into your project. Embedding a file also means that any edits you make to the embedded object do not depend on the original file remaining accessible. This is particularly useful in scenarios where you're concerned about file management and ensuring all components of your project remain intact, regardless of the file system or linking issues at a later stage. While linking files can be more efficient in terms of file size and allows for easier updates, it does require the original file to remain accessible. If you're unable to access the original reference file, the embedded option safeguards your work by ensuring that the graphics or images are contained within your Photoshop document.
