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Explanations

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1. During a fire exchange, what are the best areas of cover on your patrol vehicle?

- A. Engine block, tire rims, bumper of patrol vehicle**

The engine block, tire rims, and bumper of a patrol vehicle are considered the best areas of cover during a fire exchange because they are made of more substantial materials that can provide better ballistic protection. Therefore, the definition as involuntary jerking is the most precise and aligns with the clinical understanding of the term.
