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## **Explanations**

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### 1. Can non-residents apply for a Missouri CCW permit?

- A. Yes, if they work in Missouri**
- B. Yes, if they own property in Missouri
- C. No, only Missouri residents can apply
- D. Yes, but only military personnel

*There are a few possible reasons why the other options are incorrect. First, option B may be incorrect because owning property in Missouri does not necessarily mean that the individual is a resident.
