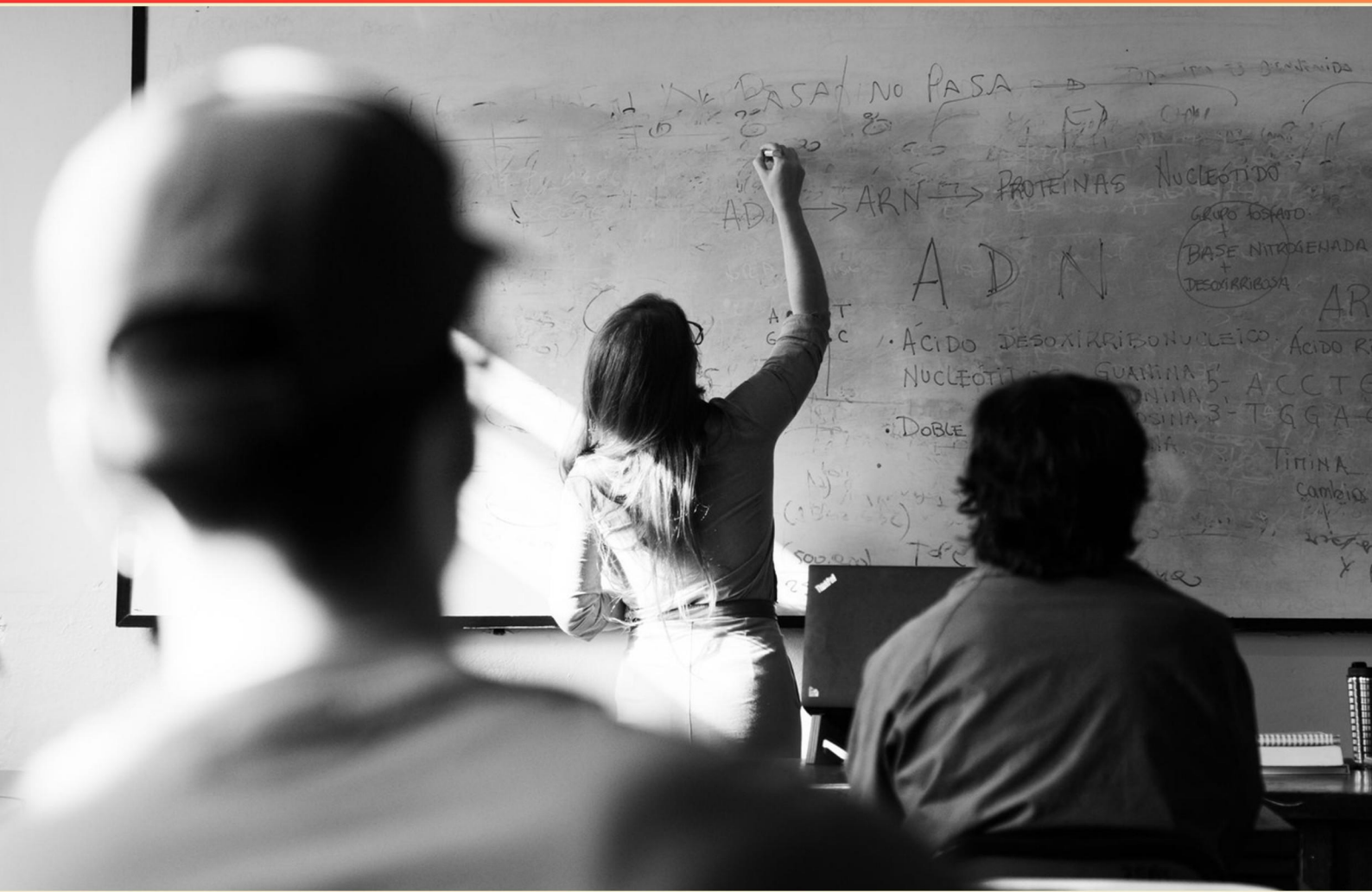

The American Degree, the highest level of achievement in FFA, is awarded to members who have shown significant growth in their SAE (Supervised Agricultural Experience), demonstrated leadership, and completed the necessary requirements. It recognizes the most dedicated and accomplished members at a national level. While there is an Honorary Degree awarded to individuals who support FFA but do not necessarily participate as members, it is not part of the degrees that student members can earn. Therefore, the correct total of degrees that an FFA member can earn is three: the Discovery Degree, Chapter Degree, and American Degree.
