This contrasts with the other areas mentioned, as vocabulary enhancement focuses more on word knowledge, creative expression pertains to originality and artistry in writing, and technical writing deals with clarity and precision in instructional or informational contexts.

Identifying parts of speech focuses explicitly on the components of language, thereby providing a clearer measure of metalinguistic competence.
