## 1. What is the FFA motto?

The statement tests your knowledge of the official FFA motto and what each part means for members. The motto presents a progression: you gain knowledge and skills by learning to do; you deepen understanding by doing to learn; you use those abilities to earn a living and support yourself; and you live to serve others, turning your learning into service. The option that matches this exact wording—Learning to Do, Doing to Learn, Earning to Live, Living to Serve—fits the official motto perfectly. Other options alter one or more phrases, changing the message (for example, swapping Earning to Live with Earning to Serve, or changing the first phrase), which is why they aren't the official motto.

## 2. In what year did the National FFA Alumni Association celebrate its 40th anniversary?

The key idea is counting anniversaries from the founding year. The National FFA Alumni Association began in 1971, so its 40th anniversary falls in 2011 ( $1971 + 40 = 2011$ ). That means 2010 would be 39th, 2012 would be 41st, and 2013 would be 42nd. This milestone marks four decades of alumni support for FFA.

## 3. What does the acronym LDE stand for?

In FFA terminology, LDE refers to activities that develop leadership through competition and teamwork. It stands for Leadership Development Event. These events are designed to build communication, problem-solving, and collaboration skills and are typically competitive, either individually or as teams, across areas like parliamentary procedure, public speaking, job interview, and more. LDEs focus on leadership development rather than technical agricultural knowledge—that's the domain of CDEs. The other phrases aren't used as the standard expansion of LDE in this context. So, the intended meaning is Leadership Development Event.

1994 is the year because the national president is elected at the annual National FFA Convention and serves for that year. The Program of Activities is a year-long planning tool used by each FFA chapter to set goals and outline activities that develop members and strengthen the chapter. It operates at the local level because it is created and carried out by the local chapter—the specific school or community unit—to organize its own events, projects, and learning experiences for the year. While state and national programs provide broader directions, the POA translates those ideas into concrete plans for the local chapter to implement, such as officer leadership activities, community service projects, and opportunities that build skills for members.

**6. Station Marker of the Reporter?**

In FFA ceremonies, station markers identify each officer's role as they participate in the opening and closing rites. The Reporter's job is to communicate the chapter's activities to the community and the public, and the flag symbolizes outward-facing communication, patriotism, and public presence. That alignment makes the flag the fitting station marker for the Reporter. The other symbols are tied to the duties of the other officers, so they don't fit the Reporter's role as well.

**7. What color was the shirt in the first Official Dress uniform?**

In the Official Dress, the goal is a clean, uniform, formal look that stays within the program's color palette. For the first version of the uniform, a dark blue shirt was chosen to harmonize with the blue jacket and the gold accents, creating a cohesive, professional appearance. This deep blue keeps the whole outfit unified without the brightness of white or the potential clash of lighter tones, and it reinforces the traditional blue-and-gold color scheme. White, light blue, or gray shirts would disrupt that cohesive look by adding too much contrast or a different tone, so dark blue best fits the intended appearance.

**8. The first Extemporaneous Public Speaking Event was held and won by Christe Peterson of Wisconsin in which year?**

Extemporaneous Public Speaking tests the ability to organize and deliver a clear speech with minimal preparation, relying on quick thinking and effective use of notes. The first time this event was held, Christe Peterson of Wisconsin won, and it happened in 1979. That year marks the launch of the competition, which is why it's the correct choice. The other years listed aren't the debut year for this event, so they don't fit the historical record of the first competition.

The question is about when the FFA established its official colors. In 1929, at the second National FFA Convention in Louisville, Kentucky, the organization adopted its official colors—national blue and corn gold. These colors symbolize the nation and the agricultural foundation of the organization, and they remain a defining part of FFA symbolism in jackets, insignia, and events.

A federal charter is formal recognition by the U.S. government that a national organization exists with nationwide scope and permanence. When President Harry S. Truman signed Public Law 740 in 1950, the FFA was granted this federal charter. That act gave FFA national status within the educational system, helping it grow from local chapters into a coordinated nationwide organization, while providing legitimacy and a stable framework for its programs and governance. The year the charter was granted is 1950.
