The Arabian Desert and the Gobi Desert also do not reach the vastness of the Antarctic Desert, with the Arabian Desert covering around 2.33 million square kilometers (900,000 square miles) and the Gobi Desert approximately 1.3 million square kilometers (500,000 square miles). This distinction in size based on the definition of a desert clarifies why the Antarctic Desert is considered the largest.

Similarly, the Mississippi River is a major river in the central U.S. but does not directly define the border between Oklahoma and Texas. The Snake River, located primarily in the western United States, is completely unrelated to this geographical context. This focus on the Red River reflects its significant role within the southern Great Plains region.
