Thus, Mexico City clearly holds the title as the capital of the nation.

Mumbai, while being the most populous city and a major economic hub, serves as the capital of the state of Maharashtra and does not hold the status of the national capital. Similarly, Bangalore, known for its significant role in the information technology sector, and Kolkata, which was once the capital during British rule, do not serve as the current capital of India. Thus, New Delhi is distinctively recognized as the capital due to its political significance and historical context.

The Mississippi River, significantly shorter, measures about 3,734 kilometers (approximately 2,340 miles) and is a major river in North America but does not compete with the lengths of the Nile or the Amazon. Thus, the Nile's established length and geographic significance solidify its position as the longest river in the world.

Madagascar, while a significant island, is not classified as a continent in its own right, as it is much smaller than Australia and does not meet the criteria set for continents. Thus, Australia stands out as the only place fitting the criteria of being both an island and a continent.

Thus, the Ural Mountains are specifically recognized for their geographical significance in separating Europe from Asia.
