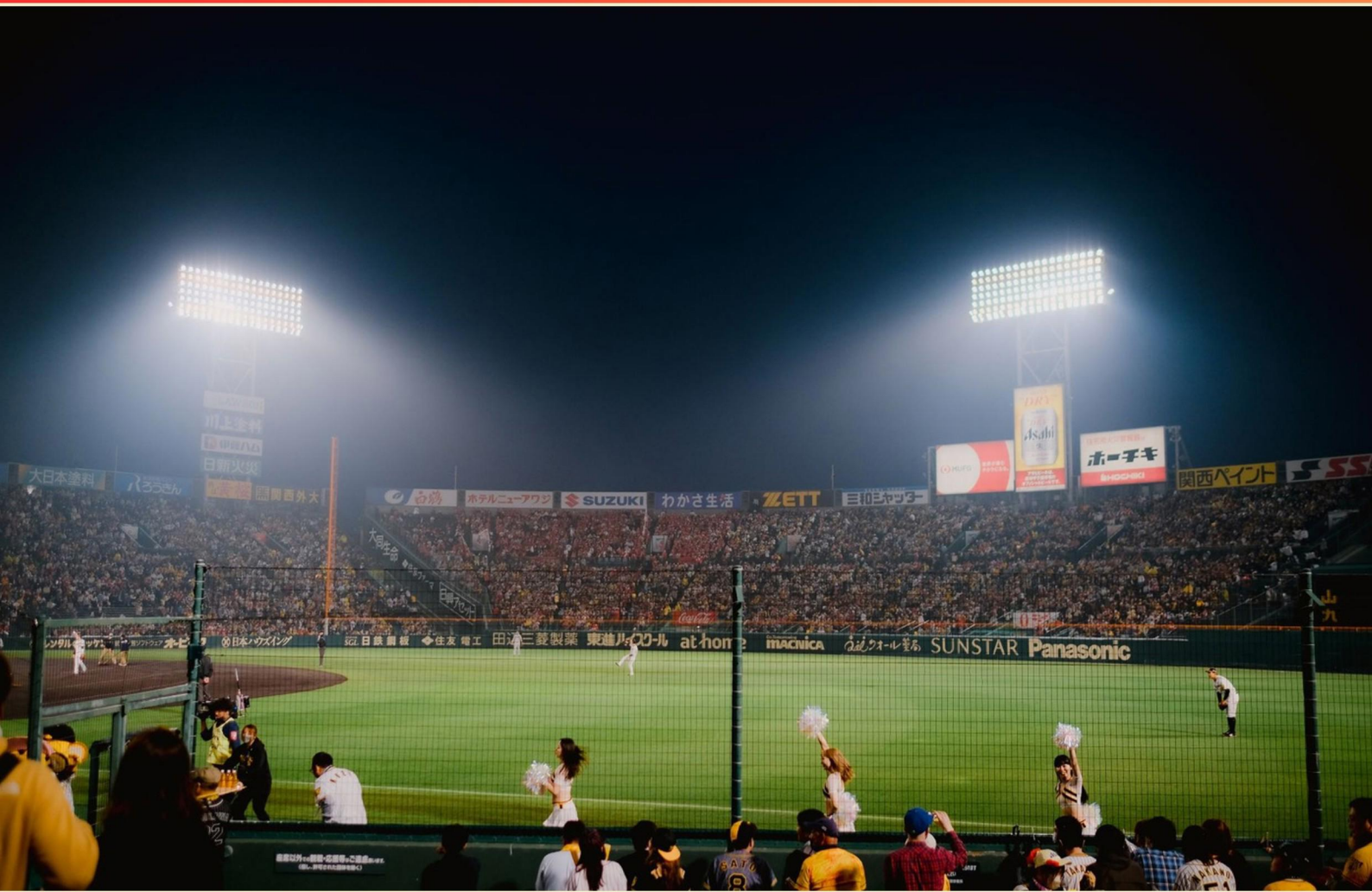

Holding the ball above the head is not a requirement for a legal pitch and may not even be a part of the pitcher's motion.
