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Explanations

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1. If you pass an ARE 5.0 division but do not complete the ARE before ARE 5.0 ends, toward which version will that division be credited?

- A. ARE 7.0

When ARE 5.0 ends, any division you already passed is carried forward to the next major version. In this transition, a division you completed under ARE 5.0 will be credited toward ARE 6.0, so your earned progress isn't lost as the exams update. It wouldn't apply to earlier or later separate versions, such as ARE 4.0 or ARE 7.0, because the policy moves you forward to the immediate successor.

2. What should candidates do if their test center is closed?

When a test center is closed, you must use the official scheduling system to reschedule or cancel your appointment. This ensures you're following the testing program's rules and preserves your testing credit while letting you pick a new date when a center is available. Waiting for the center to reopen won't resolve the situation, and simply trying to take a different exam at a later time isn't the proper workflow. If you cancel, you may be eligible for a refund or credit per policy, but the essential step is to initiate the reschedule or cancellation through the proper channels.

If misconduct occurs, the consequence is that the exam is impacted or canceled and no refunds are provided. This stance reinforces that attempting to cheat or violate rules isn't rewarded with financial relief, and it helps ensure all candidates are treated consistently. Other options would undermine that fairness or deterrence. Partial refunds after a review could create incentives or ambiguity about serious violations, a discounted new exam might imply leniency, and posting results with a misconduct note doesn't address the financial impact or due process. The no-refund policy clearly aligns with upholding the certification process's integrity.

The opportunity type reflects professional service and governance within the architecture profession. Holding the NCARB Certificate signals that a practitioner has met established standards and is trusted to contribute to licensure and practice policy. Because of that standing, certificate holders are often invited to volunteer on licensing boards and NCARB committees, helping shape licensure requirements, reciprocity, continuing education, and accreditation processes. These roles are typically unpaid and focused on leadership and policy rather than training or discounts. In contrast, scholarships are for students and internships are paid work experiences, so those options don't align with the typical activities tied to the NCARB Certificate.

When returning from a break in a proctored online exam, you must notify the proctor via chat before resuming. This communicates that you're back, allows the proctor to re-establish supervision, and ensures the session's timing and security logs reflect the break and restart correctly. Resuming without notification can leave the proctor unable to verify you're the same test-taker or to re-enable monitoring, which can trigger integrity flags. Submitting the exam ends the session and is not the action required to continue after a break, and continuing without proper notification may violate exam procedures.

Your ARE score is determined by adding up points earned on all items that count toward scoring, excluding pretest items. Each item is worth one point if you answer it correctly, and zero if you don't. Pretest questions are included to evaluate new items and do not count toward your final score, so they don't affect the total. In short, the total reflects only the correctly answered scored items, not any pretest questions.

ESL accommodations add time by a fixed percentage of the original test duration to offset slower language processing. The standard percentage used for ARE 5.0 ESL accommodations is 20 percent. So you'd increase the scheduled time by one-fifth. For example, a four-hour exam gains 48 minutes (20% of 240 minutes), totaling 288 minutes. This extra time is to provide equal access and must be approved through the testing provider with the required documentation.

It does not grant international practice rights, does not waive required licensing exams, and it doesn't automatically reduce continuing education requirements—licensing boards set those rules, though some may accept NCARB credits toward CE. In short, its main value is recognizing standardized qualifications to facilitate licensure and practice in multiple jurisdictions.

This data-driven scrutiny helps ensure that scores accurately reflect ability rather than chance, timing, or external influences. They examine response patterns, timing, item performance, and fairness across groups, and they may calibrate items and set scoring standards to maintain reliability and validity. Drafting new questions is the job of item writers and test developers. Security checks at centers are handled by test security personnel. Scheduling test centers falls under test administration or operations.

Replacement seats are time-limited. After you cancel, you have a 12-month window to use the replacement exam seat, counted from the date of the cancellation (the transaction). If you don't schedule a new appointment within that year, the replacement seat expires. This avoids indefinite holds and provides a clear, fair window for rescheduling.
