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Explanations

Understanding how we classify daily tasks helps explain why shopping, cooking, and cleaning are grouped together. Basic self-care tasks—like bathing, dressing, eating, transferring, toileting, and maintaining continence—are called activities of daily living. The tasks listed—shopping, cooking, and cleaning—are more complex and require planning, decision-making, and organizing routines. These are known as instrumental activities of daily living, the skills needed to live independently in the community. If someone has trouble with these, it often signals a need for support even if their basic self-care remains intact. The other options don't fit because quality of life describes overall well-being, not a type of task, and functional ability is a broad term for overall capacity rather than a specific category of activities.

This cycle keeps improving rather than hitting a plateau. For context, Total Quality Management is a broader philosophy that aims for long-term success through customer focus and involvement of everyone, not just ongoing improvement. Quality Assurance emphasizes preventing defects by ensuring processes meet standards, but it's more about compliance and audits than a constant, iterative cycle. Quality Control focuses on detecting defects in outputs after they're produced, which is reactive rather than proactively enhancing processes.

Quality of Life covers overall well-being but doesn't specifically describe the mode of providing care to preserve independence. Accurate Care is about correctness and safety in care tasks, not the adaptiveness of care to the individual's functioning.

A Line Organizational Chart shows authority flowing from the top down with clear lines of responsibility. In contrast, a matrix organizational chart distributes authority across two dimensions (such as functional and project lines), which creates dual or multiple reporting relationships and can blur who is responsible for decisions. A job description is not an organizational chart at all—it outlines responsibilities and duties of a role, not the reporting structure. A task outline focuses on the sequence of tasks, not on who oversees or approves them within an organization.

By contrast, crystallized intelligence reflects accumulated knowledge and skills—facts, vocabulary, and learned procedures—that you apply but don't typically need to invent in novel contexts. The other terms don't describe cognitive problem-solving abilities, so they don't fit this prompt.

It's a continuous cycle that aligns staffing with organizational goals, budgets, and projections, covering recruitment, training, succession, retention, and scheduling to ensure the right people are in place when needed. Recruitment, preliminary screening, and interviews are specific steps within the hiring process, whereas human resource planning is the overarching, ongoing activity that ensures staffing levels and capabilities are met over the long term.

This makes it possible for participants to participate meaningfully and feel secure, which is the essence of a therapeutic environment. Intervention describes a specific action or program, SMART is a goal-setting framework, and adaptation refers to adjusting tools or activities; none capture the overall aim of designing the setting itself the way a therapeutic environment does.

Performance Improvement goes beyond fixing issues to systematically analyze how care processes can be changed to prevent problems from happening again. When you put them together, you get a continuous, data-driven program that evaluates performance, tests changes, measures impact, and sustains improvements across the organization. That integrated approach is why the standard expansion uses “Quality Assurance and Performance Improvement.” The other phrasings don’t reflect this combined, ongoing effort in the way CMS and most long-term care settings implement QAPI.
