Prior to the amendment, poll taxes were often used as a means to disenfranchise poorer citizens, particularly in the South. The other options, while acknowledging aspects of voting, do not directly relate to the abolition of the poll tax. For example, stating that either gender or any citizen can vote does not address the restriction or requirement of a poll tax. Similarly, referencing male citizens of any race does not consider the broader context of voting rights that includes all citizens over eighteen and highlights the fundamental principle of eliminating barriers to voting based on financial requirements.
