In Nevada, the legal blood alcohol concentration (BAC) limit for drivers aged 21 and over is set at 0.08%. "Mission Accomplished" sounds more informal and may not accurately reflect police reporting standards. Similarly, "Duty Concluded" could imply that the officer's entire shift or responsibility has ended, rather than focusing on the completion of a specific assignment. Hence, "Assignment Complete" is the most precise and appropriate terminology for indicating that an assigned task has been successfully finished.

Other responses might simply be identifiers or codes that do not convey the necessary level of detail regarding the status of the particular unit on the call. Using a standardized and recognized format helps maintain a smooth flow of communication among units during operations.
