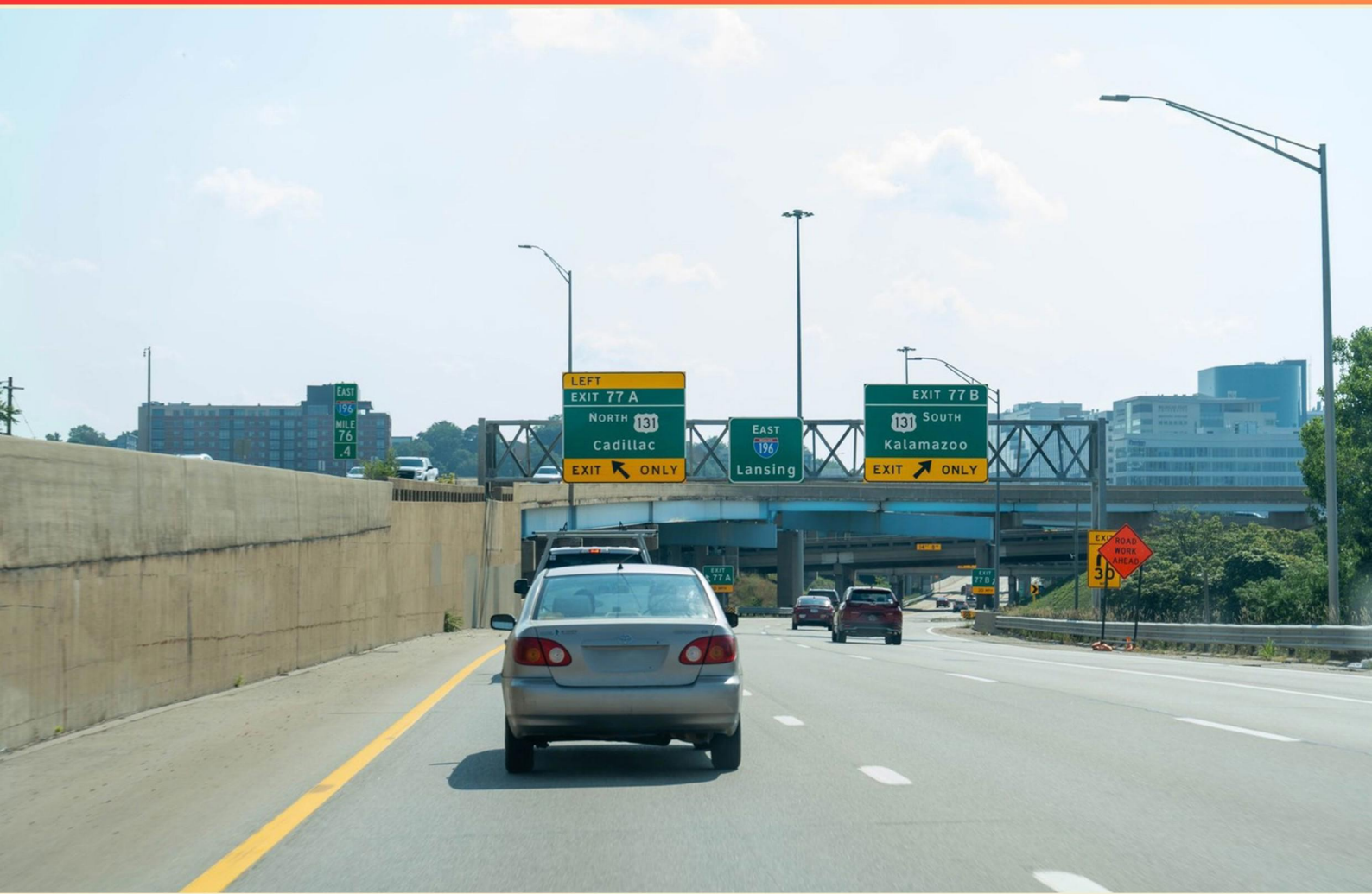

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Explanations

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1. What is the term for the distance a vehicle travels while braking?

The term for the distance a vehicle travels while braking is known as braking distance. This is the distance a vehicle covers from the moment the driver applies the brakes until the vehicle comes to a complete stop.
