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Explanations

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1. Which examination must an applicant take to become a licensed physical therapist?

To become a licensed physical therapist, an applicant is required to take the National Physical Therapy Examination (NPTE). The other options do not adequately reflect this required time frame for rescheduling and do not align with the established policies. Hence, they would not be suitable choices in this context.
