Slowing down and proceeding through the water may reduce speed-related hazards but does not eliminate the potential dangers inherent to unknown water depths or obstacles hidden underneath. Turning back and finding an alternate route could be a reasonable choice in some scenarios, but if it's safe to steer around the puddle, that is often the most efficient and safest solution.
