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Explanations

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1. Which word describes someone born in a particular place?

- A. Immigrant
- B. Foreigner
- C. Native**
- D. Tourist

Being born in a place is described by the word native. Native signals birth origin and local belonging to that area. An immigrant is someone who moves from their birthplace to live elsewhere; a foreigner is someone from another country; a tourist is someone visiting temporarily. So the term that best describes someone born in a particular place is native.

2. Which word means burning?

- A. Scintillating
- B. Discerning

Understanding words that convey burning, whether in a physical sense or a figurative one, helps when a term is defined as capable of burning or corroding. Caustic fits this idea precisely: it literally describes substances that burn or aggressively corrode, and it can also describe remarks that burn someone emotionally because they are biting or severely critical. The other words don't carry that sense. Scintillating means shining brilliantly or being exciting and clever, not burning. Discerning refers to good judgment or perceptiveness. Tepid means lukewarm or showing little enthusiasm. So caustic is the word that means burning.

Understanding words that describe temperament helps you pick the one that fits a given clue. The term that means easily angered or provoked is choleric. It describes a quick, irritable temperament and has historical ties to the idea of yellow bile being linked to anger. The other options point to unrelated ideas: dwindle means to decrease gradually, alchemy refers to transforming substances (like metals), and blockade is something that blocks passage. So the word that best fits the description is the one meaning hot-tempered and irritable.

The other options don't fit because betrothed means engaged to marry, and relinquish means to give up or surrender something, not to set free.

Motivation is about being driven to act, energized by a goal or interest. The word that best fits this sense is inspired, which means being stimulated to act by enthusiasm, vision, or a compelling idea. Indifferent signals a lack of interest, exhausted points to fatigue, and discouraged suggests losing confidence or hope—none of which capture the active, energized drive that motivation implies. Therefore, inspired is the closest match to motivated.

7. Which term means to cover or pave with small broken stone?

- A. Necrosis

The concept tested is a term for paving with small broken stone. Macadamize is the verb that describes covering a road with crushed stone and pressing it to form a hard, compact surface. This technique, named after engineer John Loudon McAdam, uses layers of angular stones to create stability and good drainage, and the idea still underpins traditional road-building. The other terms refer to unrelated ideas: necrosis means tissue death, presaged means foreshadowed, and quarantine means isolation to prevent disease spread. So, macadamize fits exactly the meaning described.

8. Which belief system asserts that life has no inherent meaning and existence is a perpetual power struggle?

Nihilism centers on the idea that life has no inherent meaning, purpose, or objective values. When meaning isn't given by nature, God, or any universal standard, people often notice that social and personal life can feel like a struggle over power, resources, and influence rather than over any fixed truth or moral order. This view treats many traditional sources of meaning as human-made constructs, which can leave existence to be defined by dynamic, competitive forces rather than by any intrinsic purpose. Realists focus on how people and states behave in the world, emphasizing power dynamics and practical outcomes, but they don't claim that life itself lacks meaning. Humanists build meaning through human potential, creativity, and ethical progress. Stoics pursue a life of virtue and align themselves with the natural order to find steady, internal meaning. So the description of life as having no inherent meaning and being a perpetual power struggle aligns most closely with nihilism.

9. Which term can mean both an obstacle and a strong defense or protection?

- A. Blockade

This question tests understanding of a word that carries both the idea of guarding and blocking something from getting through. A bulwark is a sturdy defensive wall or barrier that protects against attack, like a shield or fortification. Because of that protective function, it can also be understood as an obstacle that stands in the way, preventing intrusion or progress. So it neatly covers both senses in one term. The other options don't fit as well. A blockade is about preventing passage, which is more about blocking than providing protection. The remaining two are unrelated in meaning: one refers to a political meeting, and the other to a temperament.

10. Which quality is lacking when something is described as drab?

- A. Brightness**
- B. Color**

- D. Gloss**

This item tests understanding of how light interacts with a surface and how that shows up in everyday adjectives. Drab describes something dull and lifeless, lacking the kind of gleam that catches the eye. Luster is the quality of a surface's sheen or glow—the way it reflects light. When something is described as drab, that reflective shine is missing, so it lacks luster. Brightness is more about how much light is emitted or reflected, which can exist without a shiny finish. Color refers to the hue, which can be dull even if there's a bit of gloss. Gloss denotes a shiny, polished finish, a specific kind of shine, but drab centers on the overall lack of that gleam, i.e., luster.
