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Explanations

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1. Imperiled means:

- A. Endangered

Imperiled describes something that is in danger or at risk of harm. It conveys a state of being threatened or endangered. Because of that, the best match is Endangered, since it is a direct synonym describing something in danger of extinction or serious harm. The other terms describe different ideas: Pacifists are people who oppose war; Set Free means liberated or released; Take Advantage Of means to exploit or misuse someone. None of these capture the sense of being in danger like imperiled does.

2. Which word means 'to disentangle, to free'?

The other terms don't fit because pacifists are people who oppose war, undulate means to move in a wavy pattern, and acrimonious describes a bitter or harsh tone—none of these names a formal group that advises the president.

6. Which word is the closest synonym for 'wriggled'?

Understanding movement verbs helps pick the closest synonym for wriggled. Wriggled implies twisting or squirming motion, often irregular and close to the ground. Jumped suggests a quick, abrupt leap away from the ground, which isn't twisting or contorted. Stood signals no movement at all. Assailable means something that can be attacked or challenged; it is open to attack, criticism, or doubt. That makes vulnerability the best fit. For example, a fort or an argument can be assailable if it can be breached or refuted. The other options describe safety or strength—invincible means unbeatable, while protected and secure imply safety, not susceptibility to attack or challenge.

10. Which word means burning?

- A. Scintillating
- B. Discerning
- C. Tepid
- D. Caustic**

Understanding words that convey burning, whether in a physical sense or a figurative one, helps when a term is defined as capable of burning or corroding. Caustic fits this idea precisely: it literally describes substances that burn or aggressively corrode, and it can also describe remarks that burn someone emotionally because they are biting or severely critical. The other words don't carry that sense. Scintillating means shining brilliantly or being exciting and clever, not burning. Discerning refers to good judgment or perceptiveness. Tepid means lukewarm or showing little enthusiasm. So caustic is the word that means burning.
