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Explanations

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1. The rule that proper nouns become adjectives when they describe nouns defines which grammatical category?

- A. Adjectives
- B. Proper adjectives**

When a proper noun describes another noun, that word functions as an adjective. This category is called proper adjectives. For example, from a place or person name we get words like American, French, or Shakespearean, which describe the nouns that follow: American car, French cheese, Shakespearean play. These are adjectives formed from proper nouns, setting them apart from ordinary adjectives that don't originate from a specific name.

The main concept tested here is plot structure, specifically the stage where conflicts are resolved and loose ends are tied up—the resolution (often called the denouement). After the climax, the story moves into the resolution, where central tensions are settled, remaining subplots are concluded, and characters' fates are clarified. This phase provides closure for the reader and wraps up the narrative arc. The correct term for this part of the story is Resolution, because it designates the concluding portion where the conflicts are resolved and the narrative comes to a close. The other options refer to test-taking actions or unrelated ideas, not to a part of how a story is structured.

3. Which term describes objects with the same size and shape?

Congruence is the idea that two figures have the same size and shape, so one can be moved (translated, rotated, or flipped) to sit exactly on top of the other. When figures are congruent, their corresponding sides are equal in length and their corresponding angles are equal. This is why it's the best fit here: it captures both exact size and exact shape. By contrast, similar figures share the same shape but not necessarily the same size (they're scaled copies). The terms equal or identical aren't the standard way to describe a relationship between shapes in geometry.

4. The distance across a circle through its center.

The distance across a circle through its center is the diameter. A diameter is a line segment with endpoints on the circle that passes directly through the center, making it the longest chord in the circle and equal to twice the radius (diameter = $2 \times$ radius). If you know the radius, you can find the diameter easily. The other terms describe unrelated ideas: perimeter is the circle's boundary length, decimal is just a numerical format, and trend doesn't relate to circle geometry.

5. Which sentence demonstrates the proper use of its as a possessive pronoun for a non-human subject?

- A. The cat licked its paw.**
- B. The cat licked it's paw.

This tests using its as a possessive pronoun for a non-human subject. Its shows ownership by something like an animal or object without using an apostrophe. In the sentence, the paw belongs to the cat, so its correctly indicates that the paw is owned by the cat: The cat licked its paw. Using it's would be incorrect here because it's is a contraction for it is or it has, not possession. The form its paw's would add an unnecessary possessive on the paw itself, which isn't needed here, and The cat lick its paw has a verb form that doesn't agree with the singular subject.

6. Which statement correctly distinguishes a common noun from a proper noun?

- A. A common noun is 'Twin Rivers Adult School'; a proper noun is 'school'.

The difference rests on general naming versus naming a specific item. A common noun names a general class of places, people, or things and isn't capitalized unless it starts a sentence. A proper noun names a particular, unique item and is always capitalized. In the statement, "school" is a common noun because it refers to any school in general. "Twin Rivers Adult School" is a proper noun because it names one specific school. This pair shows the contrast clearly: a general term versus the exact name of a single entity. Other options can also illustrate the idea, but this pairing makes the distinction most explicit by using the general category and the specific named instance for the same kind of thing.

7. Which sentence correctly uses a hyphen in a compound adjective preceding a noun?

When a compound adjective comes directly before a noun, it's typically joined with a hyphen to show it functions as a single modifier. Here, "post-apocalyptic" means a world after an apocalypse and it describes the noun "films." The hyphen makes it clear that the two words work together as one idea rather than two separate adjectives. Without the hyphen, or by writing it as one unhyphenated word, the standard usage misreads or clutters the meaning. Hence, the form with the hyphen correctly conveys that these are films depicting events after an apocalypse.

8. The central, underlying, and controlling idea of a paragraph or work of literature is called what?

- A. Moral
- B. Plot

The main concept being tested is the theme: the overarching message or insight about life or human nature that a work conveys. It's the idea readers carry with them after the details fade. It's broader than what happens (plot), a single lesson about right or wrong (moral), or the main problem characters face (conflict). A theme isn't just a plot point or a single incident; it's the deeper meaning that emerges from the story's events, character growth, motifs, and tone. You can often infer it by looking for patterns, recurring ideas, and how the characters' choices and consequences illuminate a larger takeaway. In this sense, the central, underlying, and controlling idea described here aligns with theme because it captures the message the author wants readers to understand about life or human experience.

9. McDonald's, Toyota, Mattel illustrate which category?

- A. Foods and restaurants
- B. Non-profit organizations
- C. Sports teams**
- D. Companies and trademarks

Recognizing branding and corporate identity. McDonald's, Toyota, and Mattel are all names of major companies with famous logos and trademarks. They show how a business's brand—its name and mark—serves as a trademark that identifies the company and its products globally. This category highlights corporate brands and the marks that protect them, not merely what the company happens to sell in a single sector. The other options don't fit because these examples aren't all about foods/restaurants, non-profit organizations, or sports teams; they're about for-profit companies and their protected brand identities.

10. Which category does 'Republican Party' best illustrate?

A. Names of groups and institutions

B. Time periods and events

C. Gods and religious texts

D. Nationalities and languages

The essential idea here is recognizing what a term refers to in the real world. The Republican Party is the name of a political organization—a group with members, leadership, and a described platform. That makes it fit into the category of names of groups and institutions. It isn't describing a time period or event, a god or sacred text, or a nationality or language, so those other categories don't apply.
