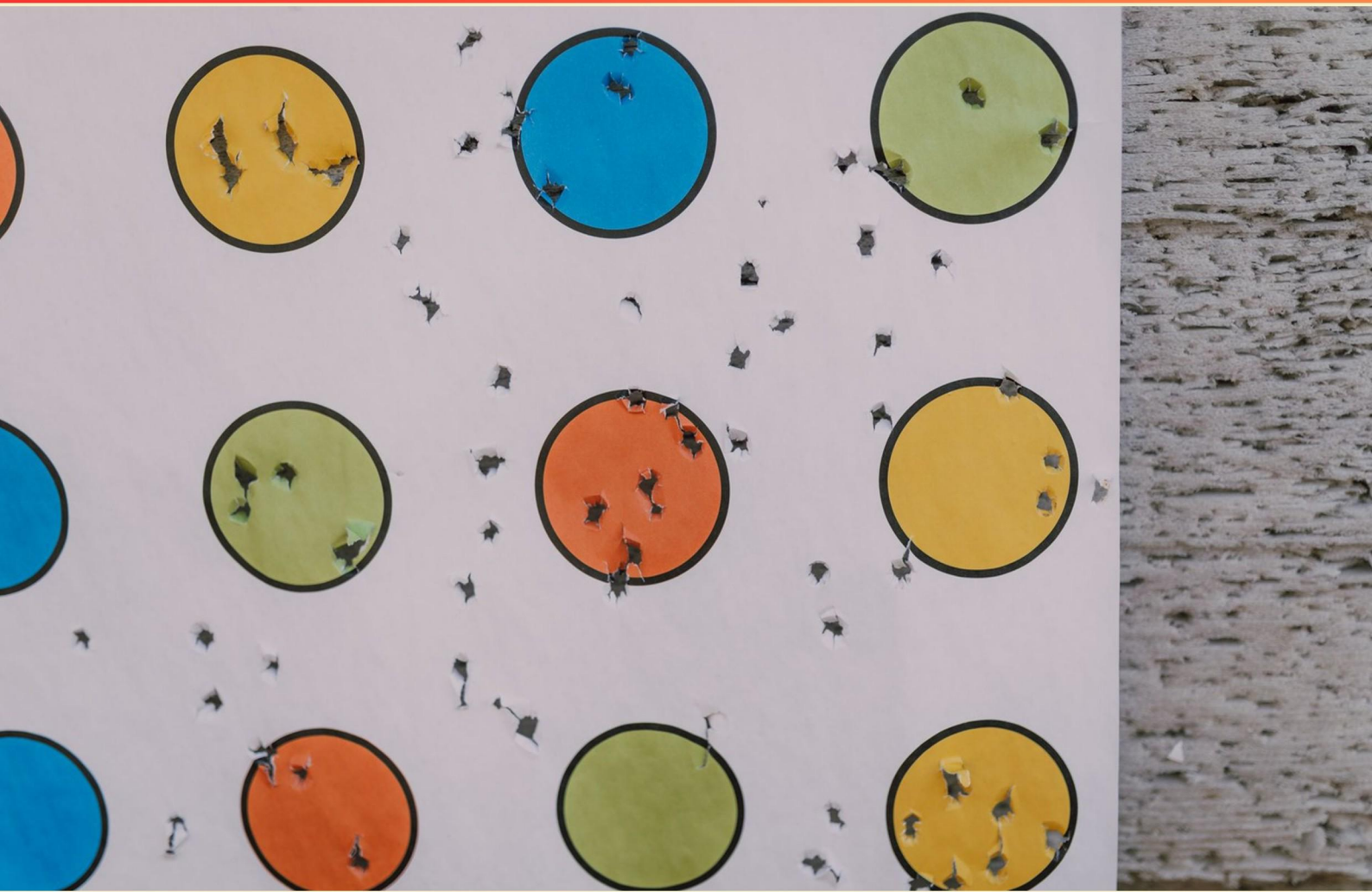

Checking only the magazine does not account for any rounds that may be in the chamber, which is vital for ensuring the firearm is safe to handle. This thorough method of checking aligns with best practices for firearm safety, emphasizing the importance of confirming the condition of all relevant parts of the
