1. Which option correctly states the purpose of the 'alarm to arrival' metric?

- A. To measure the time from alarm receipt to hospital handoff.
- B. To track how quickly apparatus is fueled.
- C. To compare shifts' average response times across the week.

Alarm to arrival is the time interval from when the alarm is dispatched to the unit arriving on the scene. This directly measures how quickly responders mobilize and reach the incident, capturing the critical sprint from alert to on-scene presence. It reflects dispatch efficiency and travel time, which are the core parts of response performance. It does not include hospital handoff, which happens after arrival, nor the prearrival tasks like fueling, and it isn't a comparison of shifts' averages—that would be a different use of the data. For example, if a unit is alerted at 10:00 and arrives at 10:04, the alarm-to-arrival time is four minutes.

Backdraft happens when a fire burns in a confined space with very limited ventilation, causing a large buildup of unburned, flammable gases. The fire consumes the available oxygen, and the room fills with these gases while heat drives them to a point where they're ready to ignite. If fresh air is suddenly introduced by opening a door or vent, that air mixes with the accumulated gases and can ignite rapidly, producing a violent burst. The description that fits this phenomenon is the sudden ignition of suspended flammable gases when oxygen is introduced to a closed space. This isn't simply a fire in a sealed room with no ventilation, nor a controlled ventilation technique or a rapid burn in a vented area; it's the explosive ignition that follows a spike of oxygen mixing with accumulated fuel gases. Signs include dense smoke and a tense, hot environment, with a sudden flash when air enters.

Standpipes are fixed building water distribution systems, providing outlets throughout a structure for firefighters to connect hoses to water supply. Attack lines are portable hoses that firefighters carry and deploy to apply water to the fire, and they can be connected to a standpipe outlet or to a water source like a hydrant. The statement is correct because it clearly distinguishes the building-fixed infrastructure (standpipe) from the portable hose used by firefighters (attack line).

4. Which station has both a ladder designation and the Water Rescue Team?

Recognizing a station that has both a ladder designation and a Water Rescue Team means focusing on two specialized capabilities: an aerial ladder apparatus and a dedicated water rescue unit. The ladder designation signals that the station houses an aerial ladder truck and the crew trained to operate it for reaching upper floors and conducting elevated rescues. The Water Rescue Team indicates the station can handle swift-water or other water-rescue scenarios. When a single station is described as having both features, it is equipped to handle incidents requiring both elevated access and water rescue skills—for example, a rescue near water where victims could be reached from above or from the water. In this lineup, the station described as having both features matches the criterion. The other stations do not include both capabilities at once.

5. What does PPV stand for in fire service ventilation?

PPV stands for Positive Pressure Ventilation. The technique uses a powered fan to push air into the structure, creating higher pressure inside than outside. That positive pressure causes smoke, heat, and gases to move toward exterior exhaust openings, while bringing in fresh air to aid occupants and firefighters and improve visibility and conditions for interior work. It's different from negative pressure ventilation, which pulls smoke out by creating a lower pressure inside; it isn't passive (which relies on natural openings), nor is it pulsed (which would imply intermittent rather than continuous pressurization).

6. Which station is EO6, MO6?

In this numbering system, the two-letter prefixes (EO and MO) identify different branches or sections, while the numeric suffix points to a specific location within that system. When the same number appears after two different prefixes, it maps to the same physical station on the department's map. So EO6 and MO6 both refer to the same place, which is Station 9. That's why Station 9 is the correct match. The other numbers would align with different stations on the cross-reference map.

7. Which is a key step of a Mayday drill to ensure readiness?

Defining Mayday triggers is essential because it gives every responder a clear, objective moment to declare distress and initiate the full emergency response. When triggers are spelled out—such as loss of radio communication, inability to respond, entrapment, losing air supply, or becoming disoriented—the crew knows exactly when to call Mayday, reducing hesitation and ensuring rapid activation of incident command, crew accountability, and rescue procedures. This readiness helps simulate realistic scenarios, verify that radios and signaling work under stress, and confirm that a Rapid Intervention Crew can be mobilized without delay. The other options don't support preparedness in a drill. Ignoring internal communication protocols undermines the drill's purpose and safety. Performing unrelated safety checks diverts attention from the Mayday process and doesn't test timely distress signaling. Archiving past Mayday reports is an administrative task that belongs after-action and doesn't practice the critical moment of declaring and responding to a Mayday.

8. What street name completes the address 4100 _____ Blvd?

Reading addresses and matching a block number to the correct street relies on recognizing directional prefixes and common boulevard names. In many cities, the block number sits on a specific segment of a major road that uses a directional qualifier like East or West. The blank should form a real street name when combined with Blvd. Here, the appropriate fill is the Eastern portion of a well-known east-west route, abbreviated E, followed by Virginia Beach, giving East Virginia Beach Boulevard. This direction helps distinguish it from other similarly named streets and places the 4100 block on the correct artery. The other options don't fit the same well-known boulevard pattern for this city, so they don't align with the address as naturally as the East Virginia Beach designation.

9. Which station's address is 4100 E. Virginia Beach Blvd.?

- A. Station 9

In this type of Fire Rescue material, each street address block is linked to a specific station in the roster or map of service areas. To find which station serves 4100 E. Virginia Beach Blvd, you look up that block in the official station map and see which station is listed for it. The 4100 block on East Virginia Beach Boulevard is assigned to Station 10, so that station is the correct match for that address. The other stations correspond to different blocks or nearby areas, so they don't align with the 4100 block.

10. What is the bowline knot used for?

- A. Tying a figure-eight knot.
- B. Using as a slip knot.
- C. Creating a fixed loop at rope end.**
- D. Tying an adjustable loop that tightens under load.

The bowline is used to form a fixed loop at the end of a rope. This loop remains the same size and won't slip when the rope is loaded, which makes it reliable for securing a line to an anchor, a post, or around a person or object. It's also easy to untie after being loaded. This distinguishes it from a slip knot, which tightens and can be hard to untie, and from an adjustable loop that tightens under load. So the best description is that it creates a fixed loop at the rope end.
