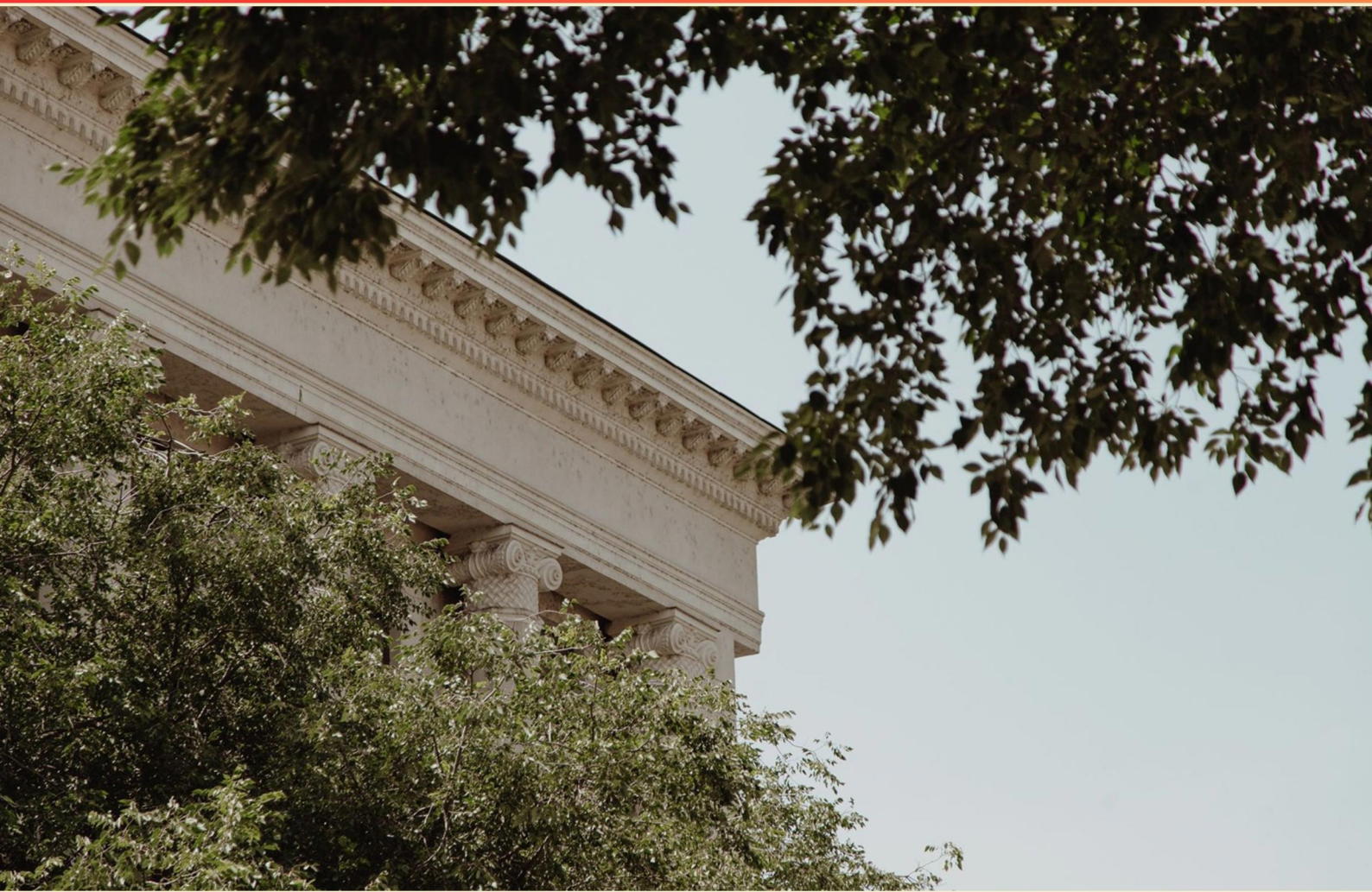

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Explanations

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1. What is the maximum number of apprentices that Kindle Funeral Home and Crematory can have if they performed 370 calls in the previous year?

In North Carolina, funeral homes are allowed a specific number of apprentices based on the number of calls they perform in a given year.
