The Bill of Rights, which consists of the first ten amendments to the Constitution, primarily focuses on the protection of individual liberties and does not establish government structure. Thus, the U.S. Constitution is the correct answer as it is the key document that officially organized and defined the United States government.

Each continent has its unique characteristics and biodiversity, forming the basis of our global ecological and societal structures. While five continents may be referenced in some contexts, such as in certain cultural or historical narratives, the widely accepted model includes seven. Similarly, the idea of six or eight continents can arise from discussions about geological and political developments or interpretations of landmasses, but within the standard educational framework, it is generally recognized that there are seven distinct continents.

Thus, the method of holding elections is central to the way North Dakota engages its citizens in the electoral process.
