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Explanations

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1. Which vulnerability arises when manipulating padding reveals plaintext?

- A. Padding oracle
- B. Side-channel
- C. Replay
- D. MITM

Padding oracle attacks exploit information revealed during the decryption process when padding is checked. In block cipher modes that require padding, the system verifies whether the padding bytes are correct after decryption. If an attacker can alter ciphertext and observe the server's response—whether it flags a padding error or proceeds normally—that response acts as an oracle about the padding validity. By carefully manipulating the ciphertext and interpreting these padding-valid vs padding-invalid signals, the attacker can recover plaintext byte by byte without the key. This specific leakage, tied to how padding is validated, is what makes it a padding oracle vulnerability. Other concepts don't describe this exact leakage. Side-channel attacks rely on indirect clues like timing or power usage rather than padding correctness; replay attacks resubmit captured messages; and man-in-the-middle attacks focus on intercepting and possibly altering traffic but don't inherently depend on padding validation leaking plaintext.

2. Under PBIED policy, discovering or recognizing a PBIED justifies which action?

When a PBIED is discovered, there is an immediate, life-threatening danger. The priority is to stop the device from detonating and to protect people. If the device cannot be safely disarmed or rendered harmless, and there's no safer alternative that can quickly neutralize the threat, using deadly force to neutralize the device is the justifiable action. Evacuation and warning are essential protective steps that reduce risk, but they don't directly halt an armed device. Detaining the individual might not be feasible or safe given the speed and danger involved. So, in the moment of recognizing a PBIED and facing an imminent threat, the option that directly mitigates the danger is to use deadly force.

3. Which data classification level requires the most stringent handling and access controls?

Data classification determines how tightly you must protect information based on sensitivity. The higher the sensitivity, the more stringent the handling and access controls. Restricted data sits at the top of that scale, so it requires the strongest protections: access only for those with a strict need to know, least-privilege access, strong authentication, encryption, comprehensive logging and monitoring, strict sharing rules, and careful handling from creation through disposal. Public data is meant for broad distribution and carries minimal controls, while Internal data requires more protection than public but less than restricted. Confidential data sits in between, needing controlled access but not the same level of rigor as restricted. Because restricted data demands the most stringent controls due to the higher risk of disclosure, it is the best answer.

4. Which of the following is NOT a Seawolf-class submarine?

In this context, class is determined by the design lineage and a shared hull-number range. The Seawolf-class includes submarines that share the same advanced design and construction: the ones named Seawolf, Connecticut, and Jimmy Carter. They all belong to the same generation with hull numbers in the low twenties and represent the follow-on to the earlier Los Angeles design. The submarine named Los Angeles, however, is part of the Los Angeles-class, an earlier design with a different hull-number series. Because it doesn't share the Seawolf design lineage, it is not a Seawolf-class submarine.

5. Which duty is responsible for supervising the security force, maintaining order, carrying out the Plan of the Day, and ensuring the health, welfare, and safety of staff members and prisoners?

The task described is the responsibility of the Master-at-Arms. This role serves as the security chief, overseeing the entire security force, maintaining order and discipline, and ensuring the Plan of the Day is carried out each shift. The Master-at-Arms also looks after the health, welfare, and safety of both staff and detainees, coordinating security measures and responses to keep the facility secure and personnel safe. Providing counseling to prisoners is typically handled by counselors or psychologists. Investigating UCMJ violations falls to legal and investigative personnel, not the security commander. Managing motorcade pace relates to transportation security rather than the daily security operations and welfare of staff and detainees.

6. Who sets the pace of the motorcade?

In a motorcade, the pace is controlled by the lead vehicle's driver—the limo driver. This person is responsible for how fast or slow the convoy moves, adjusting speed for road conditions, traffic, and the security plan to keep a safe following distance while ensuring timely arrival. They stay in touch with the security lead and make real-time decisions about acceleration, braking, and stops based on the overall plan and conditions. The other roles listed aren't responsible for driving the lead vehicle or setting the convoy's speed, since their duties are supervisory, investigative, or support-oriented rather than operational driving.

7. Which role includes protective detail, security driving (lead, limo, and follow vehicles), site advances, protective surveillance, and command post functions?

Protective detail and security operations are centered on safeguarding people, coordinating movement, and overseeing security posture at facilities or during events. Master-At-Arms personnel are trained for force protection and protective services, which includes conducting protective details for VIPs, coordinating security driving with lead, limo, and follow vehicles, performing site advances to secure venues, carrying out protective surveillance to spot threats, and serving in command posts to plan, coordinate, and respond to security needs. This combination of duties is specific to protective security roles. A limo driver focuses on transportation and may not engage in surveillance, site planning, or command post functions. A Brig Duty Officer is typically tied to custody and facility operations rather than protective details for individuals or event-level security management. Correctional counselors work with inmate programs and rehabilitation, not protective security operations.

8. Where are the Strategic Weapons Facilities located?

Two Strategic Weapons Facilities are located at naval bases that support submarine-based strategic weapons: one at Bangor in Washington (Pacific) and the other at Kings Bay in Georgia (Atlantic). The correct description names both sites, Bangor, WA and Kings Bay, GA, reflecting that there are two facilities serving different oceanic theaters. Bangor, ME is not a location for these facilities, and listing only one site omits the other.

9. What term best describes a tool used by personnel at all levels to identify, assess, and manage risks?

A framework for risk management must help people at all levels identify, analyze, and act on risk. A decision-making tool is the best fit because it guides how to evaluate options, weigh potential consequences, and choose actions that reduce risk. It supports involvement from frontline staff to leadership, enabling proactive mitigation rather than just documenting risks or sharing information. Think of risk assessment checklists as useful for making sure nothing is missed during identification, but they don't inherently drive ongoing management decisions. An incident reporting system collects details after events have occurred, which is reactive rather than the forward-looking decision process. A security briefing template communicates important information but isn't itself a method for evaluating options and deciding on risk-reducing actions.

10. Which VPN type uses TLS to secure channels and is typically accessed via standard web browsers?

TLS-based VPNs secure the connection using the TLS protocol, the same security layer web browsers rely on for HTTPS. Because browsers already speak TLS, these VPNs can be accessed through a regular browser via a web portal without needing a separate VPN client, making them convenient for browser-based use. The other options rely on different mechanisms: IPsec VPNs typically require a dedicated VPN client and operate at the IP layer; PPTP is an older protocol with weaker security; SSL VPNs also use SSL/TLS for secure access and are browser-friendly, but the term TLS VPN specifically highlights the TLS-encrypted channel, matching the described access method.
