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Explanations

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1. What might happen if a CCW permit holder from Ohio inadvertently carries a concealed firearm into a prohibited establishment?

- A. Their permit will be automatically revoked

If a CCW permit holder from Ohio carries a concealed firearm into a prohibited establishment, they could face serious consequences such as being charged with a felony. Therefore, it is important to always check for any posted signs before carrying a concealed weapon in a church in Ohio.
