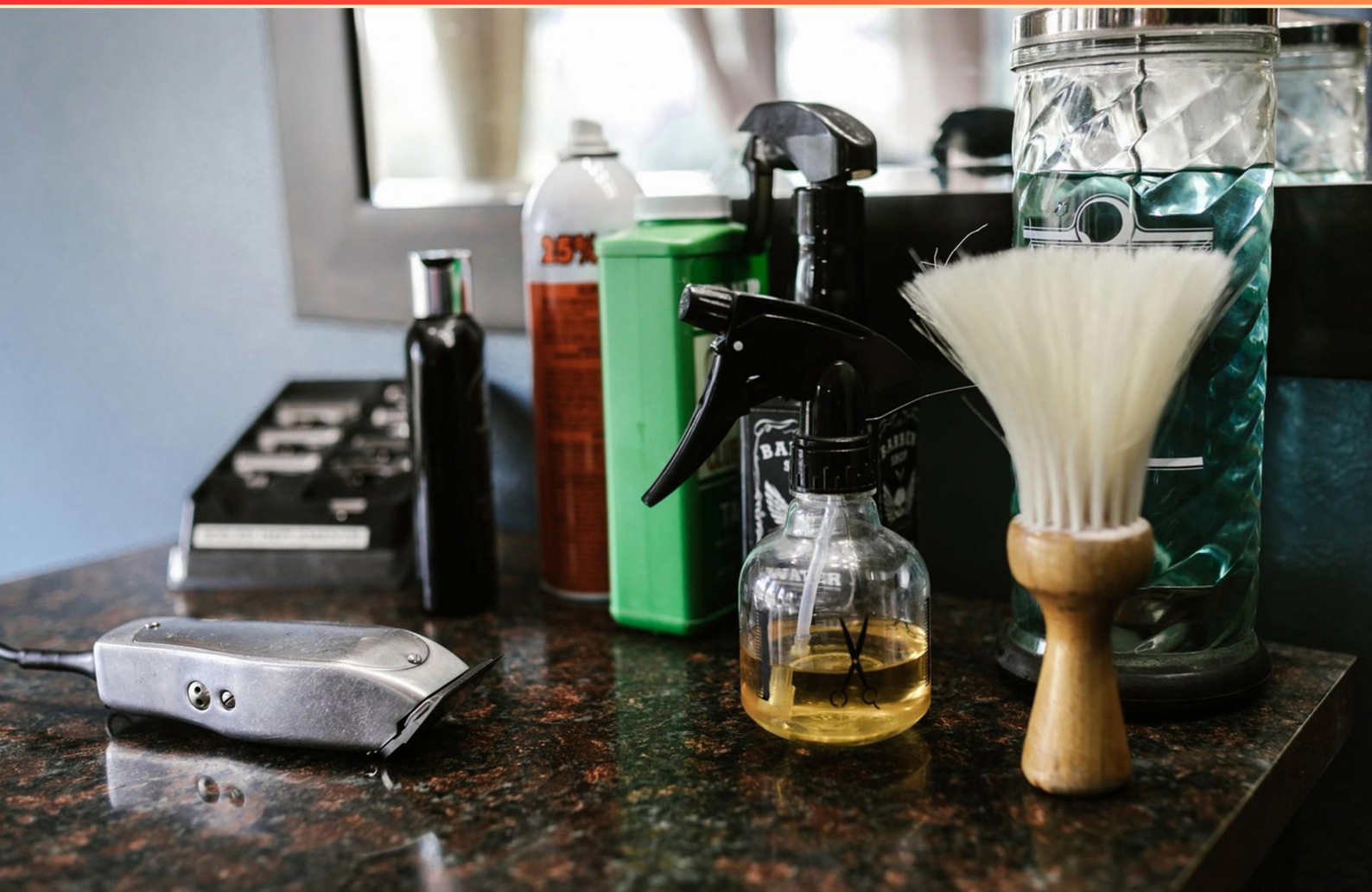

The comb itself guides and positions hair but doesn't cut. Clippers can produce clean, even shapes and strong edges for fades, but for the most precise outlining and detailing, a razor is the better choice.
