Therefore, the choice of 2.5 hours is ideal for ensuring that the chapter banquet is productive, enjoyable, and leaves participants with a positive experience.

In the FFA, there are five degrees of active membership, and three of these are specifically awarded at the chapter level. The other two degrees, the State Degree and the American Degree, are awarded at higher levels, specifically at the state and national levels, respectively. This structure emphasizes local engagement and recognizes students for their accomplishments in their own communities before advancing to higher levels of recognition.
