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Explanations

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1. Given f defined by $f(1)=4$, $f(2)=5$, $f(3)=6$, which statements are true about this mapping?

A. It is a function and linear with $f(x) = x + 3$ for x in $\{1,2,3\}$

B. It is a function but not linear

C. It is not a function

D. It is neither a function nor linear

The mapping assigns exactly one output to each input, so it is a function. The outputs follow a simple pattern: each time the input increases by 1, the output increases by 1 as well, and the difference between output and input is constant at 3. That means the rule $f(x) = x + 3$ fits all the given pairs (1 4, 2 5, 3 6). On this domain {1, 2, 3}, that makes the mapping linear. Therefore, it is both a function and linear with $f(x) = x + 3$ for these inputs.

2. Pillows, blankets, sheep skin, draw sheets and weight distribution pads and pressure padding should be stored in which way?

Storing these textiles in closed storage protects them from dust, moisture, and pests, helping keep them clean and in good condition for patient care. Closed cabinets or closets also support proper organization and prevent exposure to humidity or light that can degrade materials like foam padding or sheepskin. Open shelving risks dust and contamination accumulating on the items, outdoor storage exposes them to weather and insects, and laying items flat on the floor invites moisture and damage. So closed storage is the best choice.

3. How far away from resident buildings must yard equipment with fuel or oil be stored?

Keeping yard equipment that uses fuel or oil away from resident buildings is about creating a safe buffer so a fire would have less chance to reach or affect living areas. Thirty feet provides a practical distance that helps block heat transfer and limits the spread of any vapors or spills toward a home. This gap reduces the risk that a fire could ignite structures or that fumes could reach interior spaces, while still being a workable distance for storing equipment. Smaller distances, like ten or twenty feet, don't offer as much protection and could violate typical safety recommendations. A much larger distance, such as forty feet, is safer but often more than what the standard requires, so thirty feet represents the minimum effective distance endorsed by common safety guidelines.

Those areas deal with standards, safety guidance, or administrative processes, while this topic points to creating the regulatory text itself. When the director of nursing is an LPN, an RN must still provide regular, professional nursing oversight to ensure quality and safety. An RN consultant brings the higher level of nursing judgment needed for complex assessments, care planning, medication considerations, and regulatory compliance. Having an RN employed for at least eight hours per week as a consultant ensures there is consistent access to RN-level expertise to guide staff, review plans of care, and support quality improvement, without requiring a full-time on-site RN supervisor. This arrangement fills the gap created by the DON's LPN status and helps maintain proper clinical standards. The other options would either neglect essential RN oversight, impose an unnecessary full-time supervision, or remove nursing leadership altogether.

6. What is the minimum weekly hours for an activity staff member?

Staffing for activity programs is guided by what residents need rather than a fixed clocking-in rule. To keep programming steady and meaningful, the hours must be enough to plan activities, oversee them, and track resident participation and preferences. A floor of at least 20 hours per week provides regular presence to offer a varied schedule and respond to residents' interests, without implying full-time coverage is always necessary. Setting a fixed 40 hours can be more than needed in smaller facilities, while 10 hours is likely insufficient to maintain consistent engagement. The idea is to ensure residents' needs drive the schedule with a practical minimum, not leaving programming sporadic or inconsistent.

7. Which statement best reflects infection control policy on excluding staff and visitors with communicable diseases?

Infection control aims to prevent the spread of contagious illnesses by stopping the flow of infection from people who could transmit it. The strongest way to protect residents, staff, and visitors is to exclude anyone who has a communicable disease from entering or working in the facility, because they could unknowingly spread pathogens to others. This approach minimizes opportunities for transmission in close-contact settings. Excluding residents with communicable diseases would deny residents care and isn't how infection control is applied in practice. Requiring masks for visitors with illness is helpful and part of layered defenses, but it does not completely eliminate the risk of transmission. Excluding personnel with non-communicable diseases isn't appropriate, since those diseases aren't spread between people, and it would be discriminatory.

8. What does financial solvency require?

Solvency is the ability to meet financial obligations as they come due. The clearest sign of this is that operations can continue because essential bills are paid on time, like payroll and other obligations. Profitability matters for long-term health, but it doesn't by itself prove you can pay what you owe today; you can be profitable on paper and still face cash-flow problems that threaten solvency. Requiring exclusive reserves for debt service or funding every new project with loans changes risk and financing structure, but they aren't the measure of solvency itself. The core idea is that timely payment of obligations shows you have the resources to keep operating and meet debts as they come due.

9. How does the author's use of a compare-and-contrast structure help explain differences between two characters?

This setup makes differences meaningful and shows how those differences contribute to the characters' outcomes or the themes the author wants to highlight, which directly supports the author's purpose. That's why the best choice is the one that says it highlights similarities and differences, clarifies motives, and supports the author's purpose. The other options describe goals not typical of a compare-and-contrast approach: accelerating plot tension, presenting a cause-and-effect chain, or using a problem-solution format.

10. Weight distribution pads and pressure padding should be stored in which manner?

Keeping weight distribution pads and pressure padding in a closed storage setup protects the equipment from dust, moisture, and damage while maintaining cleanliness and shape. Closed storage also prevents these pads from becoming tripping hazards or getting contaminated when left out on the floor. Storing them openly or on the floor increases exposure to elements and wear. A locked room isn't typically required unless your policy calls for extra security; the key point is to have them stored in a closed enclosure.
