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## **Explanations**

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**1. The community service activities reflect which guiding principle of Omega Psi Phi?**

Community service activities embody the uplifting principle, which centers on lifting up people and communities through acts of service and support. When members volunteer, mentor, or assist programs that help others grow and thrive, they demonstrate a commitment to service beyond self and to improving society. Public relations is about how the fraternity presents itself to the public, which can be influenced by service but is not what the action itself directly demonstrates. Competitive excellence focuses on achieving high standards in academics, athletics, or leadership, not the act of serving others. Secrecy concerns confidentiality within the organization and is unrelated to community service. Thus, the uplifting principle is the best fit.

While fundraising, memorizing ritual words, and expansion are part of fraternity life, they do not capture the primary purpose of this early education period, which is to develop a knowledgeable, committed, and ready-to-serve membership.

When he comes back in time, the two friends fulfill their vows, and even the tyrant is moved by the depth of their commitment. This story uses their unwavering fidelity to show that true friendship rests on promises kept and a willingness to stand by one another, even at great personal risk. Courage and prudence or temperance appear in the background, but the defining takeaway is the enduring loyalty and trust that binds the pair.

Discretion is using good judgment about what you say and how you act, especially when trust, information, or potential consequences are involved. It means being aware of what you know and what you don't know, recognizing your limits and your capabilities, and choosing to share or withhold information accordingly. In practice, discretion keeps you from overstepping, protects confidences, and guides you to seek input when a situation is beyond what you can decide alone. That balance of knowing your limits and what you're capable of doing is what makes this description the best fit. The other behaviors—speaking loudly, revealing secrets, or never making a decision—don't align with prudent judgment.

Omega Psi Phi upholds a strict no-hazing policy, prohibiting any form of hazing in all initiations and activities. This aligns with the fraternity's commitment to safety, dignity, and equal treatment for every member, and it supports the values of character, scholarship, and service that guide brotherhood. Hazing can cause real harm, violates laws and university rules, and erodes trust among members, so eliminating it altogether is essential. The idea that hazing is allowed for veterans, optional, or primarily the mentors' responsibility conflicts with the universal prohibition and would undermine the safety and unity the policy is designed to protect.

## 6. How many knocks are there to enter the frat?

This question tests recall of the exact count used in the entry ritual. Ten knocks are the standard number used to request admission into the fraternity in this context, which is why that choice is correct. These tests focus on five core character traits that Omega Psi Phi emphasizes for neophytes: Discretion, Faith, Obedience, Endurance, and Courage. Discretion means using good judgment and keeping confidences, acting with propriety in all fraternity matters. Faith represents trust in the process, in the fraternity's ideals, and in one's commitments. Obedience reflects a readiness to follow directions from those who lead and to uphold the rules of the group. Endurance is about perseverance—staying committed and pushing through the challenges of initiation and ongoing responsibilities. Courage is the ability to face difficulties, stand up for what's right, and uphold the fraternity's values even when it's tough. While other lists include virtues like prudence, wisdom, patience, humility, or discipline, the traditional set highlighted here centers on these five, making them the best fit for describing the tests a neophyte is expected to meet.

This motto is Latin. The vocabulary and grammatical forms clearly point to Latin, not Greek, Hebrew, or English, which would show different words and structure.

The idea being tested is remembering the three groups that the ships phrase uses to describe who rides in the frat ships. The best choice names all three: Friends, Comrades, and Scholars. Each group represents a facet of the fraternity’s life—friends bring social support and fellowship, comrades symbolize loyalty and collective effort, and scholars emphasize learning and achievement. When you include all three, the concept is complete and accurate. Leaving out any one group means you’re missing part of the picture, which is why the other options aren’t correct.
