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Explanations

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1. In the story of David and Jonathan, what is emphasized about their relationship?

The relationship is a deep, binding friendship sealed by a covenant. The story emphasizes that Jonathan loves David as himself and that their souls are knit together, a bond far beyond ordinary friendship. Jonathan swears a solemn oath before God to protect David, even at personal risk, and he marks that commitment with tangible tokens, like giving David his robe, armor, and belt. This covenant ensures mutual protection, loyalty, and trust, shaping how they stand by each other through danger and political turmoil. It isn't portrayed as a business partnership, nor a mentor-mentee dynamic, and it isn't simply about rivalry for the throne—the emphasis is on a friendship that is formally bound and spiritually confirmed.

That's why the option describing keeping in mind helpful things and avoiding hurting others with honor is the best fit. It captures the idea of thinking before you act, safeguarding trust, and treating people with respect. The other choices clash with this restraint—acting impulsively, sharing every secret, or always speaking first—as none of those embody careful consideration and responsibility.

Districts oversee both undergraduate and alumni chapters, not just alumni ones.

External qualities like wealth and status or beauty and charm might attract people at first, but they don't secure deep, lasting friendship. Those traits can fade or invite opportunistic interactions, whereas true friendship is grounded in how you show up for the other person. Likewise, pursuing personal gain tends to turn relationships into transactions rather than genuine connection. So, embracing self abnegation and self sacrifice signals that you value the friendship for what it is, not for what you can get from it, and that belief is what sustains real, enduring friendship.

The key idea is the four cardinal principles that guide Omega Psi Phi. The fraternity explicitly names Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance, and Uplift as these core pillars. Brotherhood, Leadership, and Service are important values in Greek-life contexts, but they aren't the four cardinal principles defined by Omega Psi Phi. So choosing Manhood aligns with the fraternity's formal framework.

Treating non-members with respect and in a way that upholds the fraternity's values is about letting character guide daily interactions. When members interact with others, they represent the standards the fraternity stands for, so conduct should reflect dignity, civility, and integrity in every encounter. The values Omega Psi Phi holds—manhood, scholarship, perseverance, and service—call for treating all people with fairness, kindness, and consideration, not with contempt, indifference, or a mindset that others are outsiders to be converted. By engaging with non-members respectfully, you demonstrate leadership, contribute positively to the community, and model the behavior a true brother should exhibit, which helps build trust, foster goodwill, and strengthen the fraternity's reputation. Contempt, indifference, or treating non-members as projects to be converted run counter to that standard. They erode relationships and can diminish the positive impact the fraternity aims to have.

Discretion means using good judgment and keeping confidences, acting with propriety in all fraternity matters. Faith represents trust in the process, in the fraternity's ideals, and in one's commitments. Obedience reflects a readiness to follow directions from those who lead and to uphold the rules of the group. Endurance is about perseverance—staying committed and pushing through the challenges of initiation and ongoing responsibilities. Courage is the ability to face difficulties, stand up for what's right, and uphold the fraternity's values even when it's tough. While other lists include virtues like prudence, wisdom, patience, humility, or discipline, the traditional set highlighted here centers on these five, making them the best fit for describing the tests a neophyte is expected to meet.

English is the language included. In this fraternity, official communications, rituals, and governance are conducted in English, so it is the language that belongs to the frat's languages. The other options—French, Spanish, German—aren't listed as part of the frat's official languages, though members may study or use them privately.

Community service activities embody the uplifting principle, which centers on lifting up people and communities through acts of service and support. When members volunteer, mentor, or assist programs that help others grow and thrive, they demonstrate a commitment to service beyond self and to improving society. Public relations is about how the fraternity presents itself to the public, which can be influenced by service but is not what the action itself directly demonstrates. Competitive excellence focuses on achieving high standards in academics, athletics, or leadership, not the act of serving others. Secrecy concerns confidentiality within the organization and is unrelated to community service. Thus, the uplifting principle is the best fit.

Diogenes of Sinope, a Cynic philosopher, is associated with the phrase "Looking for an honest man." He famously used provocative acts to expose hypocrisy and challenge social pretensions, and one well-known story has him wandering Athens in daylight with a lantern, declaring that he is searching for an honest man. This image captures his belief that true virtue is rare in ordinary people and serves as a sharp critique of society's values. The other figures—Socrates, Aristotle, and Plato—are influential for other reasons, but the lantern-search anecdote is a distinct hallmark of Diogenes.
