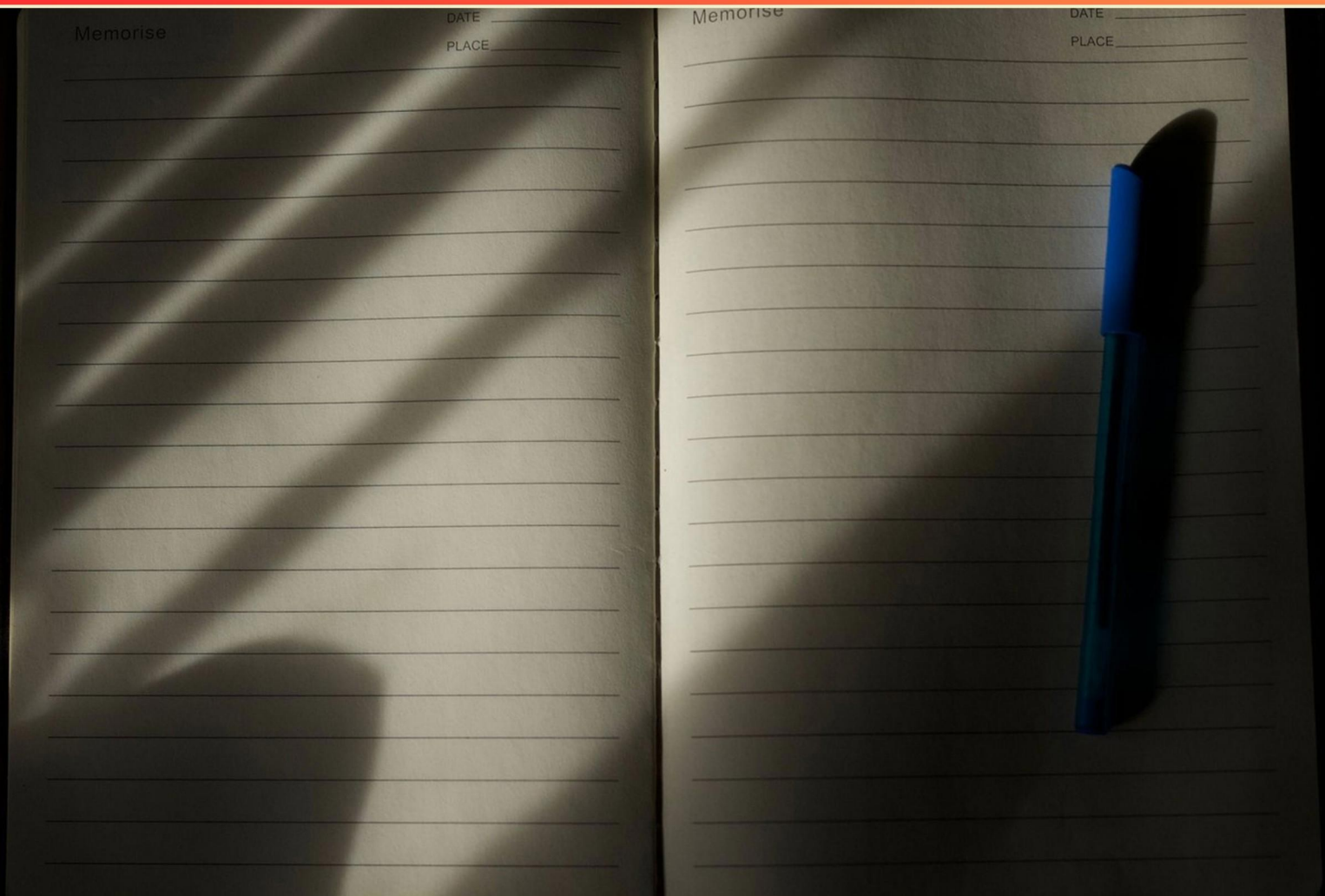

Information collected without consent also contradicts PIPEDA's core principles, which emphasize the necessity of obtaining an individual's consent before collecting or utilizing their personal data.

While mandatory retraining, increased fees for license renewal, and warnings for minor infractions may be potential responses to certain situations, they do not capture the full scope of serious disciplinary actions available for significant regulatory breaches. Fines and the possibility of suspension or revocation are more severe penalties that can fundamentally affect an investigator's ability to practice, thereby underscoring the importance of regulatory compliance.
