In the Order of the Eastern Star, local chapters are under the authority of a higher-level body called the Grand Chapter. The Grand Chapter oversees all the local chapters within its jurisdiction, handling charters, by-laws, and ritual standards, and providing guidance and support to the chapters it supervises. The Blue Lodge is the basic Masonic body for male Freemasons and is not the governing body over OES. The Grand Assembly governs a different youth organization, and the Supreme Council is associated with another branch of Freemasonry, not the OES.

2. Which officers commonly appear on the Chapter's leadership team besides the Worthy Matron?

In the Chapter's leadership team, two roles stand out as the practical backbone of daily governance: the Treasurer and the Historian. The Treasurer handles all finances—receipts, dues, charitable funds, and payments—keeping the Chapter's finances transparent and in good order so the group can operate smoothly year to year. The Historian is responsible for recording the Chapter's activities, preserving minutes, milestones, and notable events, which creates a reliable record that future officers can follow and that supports clear reporting to Grand Chapter. Because these two functions—financial stewardship and historical record-keeping—are foundational to running the Chapter, they are commonly included on the leadership slate beyond the Worthy Matron. Other roles like Conductress, Chaplain, Marshal, or Sentinel serve important ceremonial or auxiliary purposes, but they are not as consistently central to the Chapter's ongoing governance as the Treasurer and Historian.

Freemasonry—the Masonic family—is the broader organization linked to the Order of the Eastern Star. The Eastern Star was created as an appendant body within Masonry, sharing the same rituals, governance, and meeting spaces found in Masonic lodges. This connection places it squarely within the Masonic system rather than as a completely separate group like Rotary International or Odd Fellows. (Shriners International is another Masonic-related group, but the fundamental affiliation described here is with Freemasonry.)

4. Which color is associated with the star point named after Esther?

Esther's star point is linked with purple. In the Order of the Eastern Star, each star point honors a heroine—Adah, Ruth, Esther, Martha, and Electa—and is matched with a distinct color. Purple is the color assigned to Esther, while the others correspond to blue, yellow, green, and red for the remaining points. This color coding helps members recall Esther's story and the virtues she represents.

5. Where are the five Star Points positioned in a Chapter Room?

The five Star Points are arranged around the room with one point on each of the four cardinal directions and a fifth at the center. In a Chapter Room, four points sit on the walls at the East, North, West, and South, and the fifth sits at the center of the room. The central point represents Electa, while the others correspond to Adah, Ruth, Esther, and Martha. This central placement completes the five-point arrangement, symbolizing unity at the heart of the star.

The raps symbolize the five heroines the Order of the Eastern Star honors: Adah, Ruth, Esther, Martha, and Electa. The five-point star used in the ritual represents these heroines, each point linked to a story and virtue the order teaches. When the Master raps, it calls the lodge to attention and reminds everyone to reflect on the example and lessons these heroines embody as work proceeds.

Charity activities. In the Order of the Eastern Star, Chapters organize their programs around service and giving to those in need, so charitable work is typically a central item on the meeting agenda. This includes fundraising for scholarships, visiting the sick, and other community service projects that reflect the organization's mission. Other options don't align with the regular Chapter focus. Social events without purpose lack the service aspect, and training seminars not related to charity don't fit the Chapter's charitable emphasis. Ceremonial investitures are ritual elements tied to officer installation and degree work rather than a standard agenda item for routine Chapter meetings.

8. What is Martha's badge?

Martha's badge uses the Broken Column within the Triangle. This emblem symbolizes sorrow and endurance in the face of hardship, reflecting Martha's example of devoted service and steadfast faith during difficult times. In the Order of the Eastern Star, each heroine has a distinct emblem within a triangle: Ruth is represented by a Cup, Adah by a Sword and Veil, and Esther by a Crown and Scepter.

9. Bethlehem is linked with which region in the passage?

Bethlehem is in Judaea, the southern region around Jerusalem. In biblical geography, Bethlehem sits in the territory allotted to the tribe of Judah, so it is described as a Judaeon city rather than in Galilee (the north), Samaria (central-northern), or Moab (east of the Jordan). Its identity as the City of David further supports this link to Judah. So, the region associated with Bethlehem in the passage is Judaea.

10. What is the role of the Treasurer in an OES Chapter?

A. Manage finances and keep financial records.

B. Lead ceremonial processions.

C. Organize charitable events.

D. Set educational curricula.

The main concept here is that the Treasurer is the Chapter's money manager. This officer's primary job is to handle finances and keep accurate records of all financial activity. That means collecting dues and other income, paying bills, managing bank accounts, and maintaining a detailed ledger of receipts and disbursements. The Treasurer also prepares budgets and regular financial reports, so members can see the Chapter's financial position, and works with the Secretary to keep records aligned. At periodic audits or reviews, the Treasurer provides the necessary documentation to show how funds are being used and to ensure compliance with governing rules. In short, keeping the books and stewarding the Chapter's funds is the core duty. Ceremonial processions and ritual leadership are tasks more closely associated with officers responsible for ceremonial duties, while organizing charitable events and setting educational activities fall to other committees or officers.
