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Explanations

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1. In a Chapter Room, where do the five Star Points sit?

- A. Left side
- B. Right side
- C. Behind
- D. Center**

The five Star Points are shown gathered around the central emblem in the Chapter Room, symbolizing unity of the virtues and the heroines they represent. Each point corresponds to one star figure (Adah, Ruth, Esther, Martha, and Charity), and their purpose is to converge at the center of the star, not sit off to the sides or behind. This central placement emphasizes that Charity unites the others and anchors the ritual symbolism, so the correct location is the center.

2. Which character's pass is 'Believest thou this?'

The line Believest thou this? comes from a moment in the Gospel of John when Jesus speaks to Martha after telling her that Lazarus will rise; he asks, "Believest thou this?" This exact question reflects Martha's response of faith in that scene. In the Order of the Eastern Star, the Pass Word associated with the character Martha is derived from that moment, highlighting her declaration of faith. So, the line is tied specifically to Martha, which is why that pass fits her. The other names are linked to different biblical episodes and phrases, not this particular question.

3. Blue Violet teaches which virtue?

Blue Violet is tied to the virtue of Faithfulness. In the Order of the Eastern Star, each color and heroine is paired with a specific virtue, and the blue-violet color links to Adah's example of loyalty and steadfast commitment. Faithfulness means staying true to one's duties, promises, and those you serve, even when challenges arise. That steadfast loyalty is what Blue Violet is meant to teach. The other options don't correspond to the established associations for this hue—frequent isn't a virtue in this context, constant is not the formal term used here, and pure speaks to purity rather than faithful loyalty.

In the Order of the Eastern Star, each point of the star is named for a Biblical heroine, and the first point is Adah, who embodies fidelity. That's why Adah sits at the first point. The other names—Ruth, Esther, and Martha—represent the remaining points on the star, not the first.

5. What is the function of the Warder in an OES Chapter?

At the heart of the Warder's role is guarding the door and keeping order during ceremonies. The Warder stands at the entrance to monitor who enters, ensuring that only members and authorized guests are admitted while rituals are in progress. This duty helps maintain the decorum and smooth flow of the chapter's ceremonies, and the Warder may also assist by announcing visitors or guiding members during processions or entrances and exits. Other officers handle the tasks of leading prayers (typically the Chaplain), overseeing finances (the Treasurer), and presenting the annual report (usually the Secretary). So, guarding the door and maintaining order during ceremonies is the function that best matches the Warder's responsibilities.

6. Which of the following is an actual flower of the Order?

In the Order of the Eastern Star, each point of the star carries a symbol tied to one of the heroines, with some points featuring emblems and one point using a flower as its emblem. The flower associated with Adah is the blue violet, which is used as the actual floral symbol of the order. The other items listed are emblems or symbols used in the ritual (crown and scepter, broken column, sword and veil) and are not flowers. So the blue violet is the genuine flower connected with the Order.

7. Which of the following lists all five flowers in the correct order?

The five flowers are tied to the five heroines in the Order of the Eastern Star, and each flower represents a specific figure in a fixed sequence: Blue Violet for Adah, Yellow Jasmine for Ruth, White Lily for Esther, Green Fern for Martha, and Red Rose for Electa. Because the tradition assigns each flower to its heroine in this exact order, the correct list is Blue Violet, Yellow Jasmine, White Lily, Green Fern, Red Rose. The other options mix up the fourth and fifth flowers, which breaks the established order used in ritual and study materials.

In the Order of the Eastern Star, symbols carry clear virtues, and the White Lily is the emblem that represents purity. So when the lesson or teaching is associated with the White Lily, it's guiding members to cultivate purity in conduct and heart, which is why the virtue described as "Pure" fits best. Other symbols in the tradition point to different virtues, but the White Lily specifically anchors the idea of purity.

In the Order of the Eastern Star, each heroine has a unique pass phrase used during ritual to identify the character being represented. The phrase "Who is this?" is the designated pass for Ruth, so Ruth is the correct match for this prompt. The other heroines—Esther, Adah, Martha—have their own distinct pass phrases, which is why they don't fit this particular cue. Remember that these character-specific passes are part of how the ritual confirms knowledge of the storyline and the figure being invoked.

10. What is the special motto?

A. Fairest Among Thousands Altogether Lovely

The special motto is "Fairest Among Thousands Altogether Lovely." This exact wording is the traditional phrase used in the Order of the Eastern Star to express a standard of beauty and virtue that stands out among many. It combines the biblical image of being fairest among multitudes with the idea of being altogether lovely, signaling complete, worthy character. The other wordings shift meaning slightly—using Beautiful, or adding Stars, or changing Grand—so they aren't the established motto.
