These are tangible, measurable outcomes that don't hinge on shifting political winds, and they tend to garner wide support because they address fundamental welfare and economic security. In contrast, the other topics point to more polarizing or platform-specific agendas—immigration and trade policy, internet censorship, or expanding surveillance. While important, they are typically associated with distinct ideological positions and can deepen partisan divides. Focusing on broadly beneficial services and economic protection signals a governance approach grounded in concrete outcomes and public trust, which is why this option fits best when considering a focus not tied to a single platform.

Claiming that learning is only about grades reduces learning to a score and ignores the process and collaboration involved.
