A wall that carries a load from above in addition to its own weight is called a load-bearing wall. These walls transfer the weight of floors, ceilings, and roofs down to the foundation, helping to hold the building up. Non-load bearing walls, by contrast, only support their own weight and serve mainly to divide spaces, so removing them doesn't affect the building's structural support. The foundation and exterior walls relate to overall structure and location, but the term that specifically describes carrying extra load is load-bearing.

Tudor style is defined by a distinctive exterior that reads as old-world and textured. The façade tends to be asymmetrical and richly textured rather than perfectly balanced. In contrast, Colonial emphasizes symmetry and evenly spaced windows with a central door, Ranch is a low, long, single-story layout, and Contemporary favors wide glass walls, minimal ornament, and modern materials.

The spaces included are kitchen, laundry room, garage, utility room, storage room, and any bathroom not attached to a bedroom because these are the utilitarian zones where daily chores, vehicle care, mechanical systems, cleaning, and extra storage take place. They support the home's functioning and organization, often grouped to keep living areas quiet and comfortable. The other options focus on primary living or exterior spaces, which aren't considered service areas.

It serves to coordinate all the trades and ensure access for maintenance. Other plans focus on different aspects: a Site Plan covers the property layout and external features, a Foundation Plan details the footings and structural base, and a Roof Plan shows the roof shape, slopes, vents, and drainage. They don't depict the interior layouts of electrical, mechanical, and plumbing systems, which is why the MEP plan is the right choice.

Exterior walls describe only part of the structure, not its use. So, when more than half of the floor area serves commercial activities, that's what classifies it as commercial construction.

Italy, Portugal, and Algeria are part of that traditional cork-producing belt, with Portugal especially known as a leading cork producer and Italy and Algeria also contributing supplies. That combination best reflects where cork flooring can be imported from in real-world supply.
