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Explanations

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1. What was stolen at the summit in San Fran?

The stolen item is the Fulgora Storm Three, a lithium battery prototype for an electric car. This answer is best because it gives a specific, unique model name tied to a high-value piece of technology, which fits the idea of a headline-worthy theft at a tech-focused summit. A generic lithium battery prototype doesn't pinpoint the exact item, and a prototype solar-powered drone or a secret manuscript describe assets that don't align with the EV-battery focus of the scenario. The named prototype stands out as the precise, plausible target in this setting.

That makes it the correct choice because it specifically refers to a hiding place designed for protection, not just a storage room or an ordinary room. Other options describe ordinary storage or living spaces and don't connote concealment for pursuers.

7. What term describes spies who specialize in creating false documents (such as birth certificates)?

The term you're looking for is forger. A forger is someone who creates forged papers—like birth certificates, passports, or visas—so a person can pass as someone else or gain access under false pretenses. In this question the focus is on a character's true identity versus an alias. In the City Spies world, the team uses code names, and the character known as Sydney has a real name that's revealed later in the story. The other names aren't the real name given in the narrative, so they don't fit the established identity of the character.

9. Why did Mother think Sinclair was leaving Paris for good?

The main idea being tested is inferring a character's intent from what they do. Here, packing up his paintings and sending them to the airport shows a decisive, final step toward leaving Paris. Packing up artwork signals he's wrapping up his life in that place, not just moving within the city or taking a temporary assignment. Sending the paintings to the airport especially points to plans to travel away, likely out of the country, rather than staying behind. While one could imagine a scenario like a job offer abroad or moving studios, those would be less convincing given the combination of packing up belongings and arranging transport for them. The specific act of shipping works to the airport communicates a clear, purposeful departure, which is why this option is the best fit.

10. Whom does winning help protect?

- A. Willy Wonka
- B. Stavros Sinclair**
- C. Leyland Carmichael
- D. Benito Vines

Winning functions as a protective shield for a key character in this scenario. The moment of victory creates conditions—such as drawing off pursuers, signaling allies to step in, or meeting a safeguard deadline—that specifically keep Stavros Sinclair safe. His role makes him the one the story relies on to stay out of danger so the larger plan can continue, which is why the win is described as protecting him. The other names aren't tied to that protective dynamic in this context, so they don't receive the same safeguarding effect from the victory.
