This placement can lead to a slight moment of confusion about who is performing the action, hence potentially diminishing clarity.

In contrast, the second sentence introduces redundancy with the expression "successfully engaging with the community is significantly important," which complicates the message. The use of both "successfully" and "significantly" adds unnecessary qualifiers that can detract from the main point. The phrasing is less direct, which may lead to confusion and a more difficult reading experience. Essentially, the first sentence conveys its message with clarity and simplicity, making it the better choice.
