This confusion can divert the reader's attention from the main point of the sentence, which decreases its clarity. Thus, the first sentence is preferred for its straightforward and unambiguous presentation of the idea, helping the reader grasp the intended message without confusion.

"Inconstant" implies variability and changeability, which directly opposes the idea of being perpetual. Therefore, "continuous" is the word that most accurately conveys the meaning of "perpetual" when discussing motion.

This choice effectively combines context, pronouns, and roles in a way that makes grammatical sense while clearly describing Mary's situation.
