This construction effectively communicates the policy's intent while maintaining brevity. In contrast, the other choices include additional language that complicates the message. For instance, saying "will ensure" or "it is necessary that" introduces redundancy and wordiness that can obscure the directive. A concise policy statement should be direct and to the point to facilitate understanding and compliance by all employees.

They mention allergies in a broader context or refer to other types of allergies, such as those to food, making them less relevant to supporting the definition of hay fever.

In contrast, the other options contain excess words or qualifiers that can dilute the impact of the message. For instance, the use of "very" and "absolutely" tends to exaggerate the point rather than present it clearly, while "often times" is less concise and implies uncertainty. The simplicity and clarity of the chosen sentence effectively convey the underlying concern about social media while maintaining an engaging tone.

Therefore, this approach is essential for creating a sense of closure and leaving a lasting impression on the reader, making option B the characteristic that best defines a thorough conclusion.

In contrast, basic vocabulary skills are important but they are only one component of reading comprehension rather than a comprehensive measure of a student's ability. Summarization, while a valuable skill, does not encapsulate the depth of understanding required by the test. Similarly, memorizing facts from a text represents a surface-level engagement that lacks the critical thinking necessary for deeper comprehension, which is the focus of the PERT reading section.

For instance, some of them introduce a dependent clause or incorrectly capitalize the subsequent clause, which disrupts the grammatical structure that a semicolon aims to maintain. Therefore, option C exemplifies proper punctuation use, enhancing the coherence and clarity of the statement.
