Starting with the Arrange Ribbon Group streamlines the workflow and is aligned with PowerPoint's organization for managing multiple elements effectively.

The Format Painter tool is designed for copying formatting from one element and applying it to another; it does not facilitate linking or navigation. Lastly, hyperlinks in PowerPoint are versatile and can link to slides, showing that the statement that hyperlinks can only link to external websites is inaccurate. This knowledge of how to navigate within your presentation effectively enhances the overall interactivity and flow of your slides for your audience.
