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Explanations

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1. Watercolor brushes are distinguished by what feature?

Watercolor brushes are primarily characterized by their short handles and soft natural or synthetic hairs. Such visual representation is invaluable for identifying patterns such as skewness, modes, and overall distribution trends which are critical for further data analysis. In contrast, options that mention the average value, relationships between two variables, or correlation coefficients refer to different statistical concepts that do not align with the primary function of a histogram. The average represents a central point rather than distribution; relationships between variables typically require scatter plots or line graphs; and correlation coefficients are numerical representations of how two variables may relate but do not visualize frequency distributions. Thus, the depiction of data frequency in a histogram is distinct and fundamental to understanding data distributions.

Thus, assemblage stands out as the art form that fully integrates these dual dimensions.
