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Explanations

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1. Iambic pentameter is evident in which combination of literary forms?

Iambic pentameter is a rhythmic pattern with five iambs per line, meaning each line has a unstressed syllable followed by a stressed one, creating a steady, musical beat. This meter is a hallmark of poetry, where lines are often crafted to a regular measure, and of dramatic verse, where this cadence helps speakers' lines sound formal yet natural when spoken aloud. Because of that, drama and poetry routinely show iambic pentameter. Prose fiction and literary nonfiction, on the other hand, aim for natural speech and narrative flow without a fixed meter, so they don't typically display this rhythmic pattern.

Reading folk stories mainly broadens students' understanding of people from cultures other than their own. Vocabulary and even historical context can appear as benefits, but the strongest, most direct takeaway is expanding knowledge of diverse cultures.

Collecting information to personalize instruction relies on understanding each student's background, questions, and growing understanding. A grade book tracks scores, not learning needs; a survey provides data at a single moment and may not reflect changes over time; reciprocal teaching is a strategy for building reading comprehension, not a primary tool for gathering information to guide instruction. So the KWL chart best supports personalizing instruction.

The other options mix authors with works they did not write: *Beloved* is by Toni Morrison, *The Color Purple* is by Alice Walker, and *Their Eyes Were Watching God* is by Zora Neale Hurston. Maya Angelou is famous for different works, such as *I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings*, not *The Color Purple*.

Denotation is the direct dictionary-like meaning of a word. When a word is followed by a brief explanation in parentheses, that explanation typically states its denotation—the exact, literal sense—so readers know the word's basic meaning in that context. This is different from connotation, which is the feelings or associations a word carries beyond its literal meaning. It's also not an annotation, which would be an extra note added outside the main text, and not about how the sentence is built. Therefore, the term that best describes the explanation in parentheses is denotation.

Think Pair Share is a collaborative discussion format that uses a three-step sequence: students first think independently about a prompt, then pair with a partner to discuss their ideas, and finally share their conclusions with the whole class. This structure gives everyone time to process the question on their own, helps them articulate and refine ideas in a low-stakes small group, and then broadens the conversation when ideas are shared with the class. The benefit is a smooth progression from individual thinking to collaborative reasoning to whole-class discussion, which strengthens understanding and participation. The other formats don't follow this exact sequence: reciprocal teaching focuses on guided reading strategies in groups, the Socratic circle centers on dialogues in a circular discussion pattern, and brainstorming emphasizes generating many ideas without the paired discussion step. This method best fits the described sequence of independent thinking, pairing, and class sharing.

When you're looking for the lesson a story teaches, you're focusing on its theme—the message about life or human nature that the author wants you to take away after reading. The theme is the underlying idea the story explores, not just what happens in the plot. You identify theme by looking for ideas that recur, what the characters learn, and what the author seems to want you to understand about people or life. It's different from central idea, which is the main point the text is about on a surface level, like the plot or information being presented. Allegory is a narrative technique where characters and events symbolize larger ideas, conveying a deeper meaning beyond the literal story. Flashback is a device that interrupts the timeline to show past events; it's about structure, not the message the story conveys. So, the term that best describes finding the lesson of a story is theme. For example, a story about friendship that shows characters choosing trust over suspicion conveys a theme about the value of trust.

Holistic scoring judges an essay by its overall quality and how well it accomplishes the task. In this approach, the emphasis is on the piece as a whole and how effectively it relates to the topic given. You look at how well the essay addresses the prompt, develops ideas with support, stays on topic, and uses a coherent structure and voice. It's not limited to one narrow aspect like grammar or understanding alone, nor is it about how consistently graders apply rules. Instead, the score reflects the overall impression of how strong the essay is in relation to the topic. That's why the best description is the overall quality of each student's essay in relation to the topic.

Understanding how an image is handled on a computer helps you see why this option fits. Inputting a picture means bringing it into the computer from a device like a scanner or camera. Saving means storing that image file so you can keep it for later. Editing means changing the image with software and then saving those changes as a new or updated file. The hard drive is the main storage space inside a computer where image files live once you've imported them and after you edit them. Without a place to store the file, you can't reliably save or revisit edits. The scanner can bring the image in, and editing software can modify it, but the hard drive is what makes saving and re-accessing the edited picture possible. That combination of storing and enabling ongoing access to the edited file is why the hard drive is the best fit here.

10. When scanning a text about global warming to determine if the article discusses negative impacts, which task is most appropriate?

When you skim a text to check for a specific idea, you're looking for evidence that that idea is covered. Here, you want to know if the article mentions negative impacts of global warming. The best task is simply to determine whether information about those negative effects exists in the text. While scanning, you'd search for any mention of downsides, risks, harms, or adverse consequences tied to global warming. If you find such mentions, you've identified that the article discusses negative impacts. If you don't find them, you can infer that the piece may not address that aspect, at least not explicitly. This differs from drawing conclusions about solutions, which involves evaluating proposed remedies; understanding new vocabulary, which focuses on word meanings; or summarizing, which requires restating the main ideas of the entire text.
