Therefore, the application of military theory to campaign planning accurately encapsulates what operational art

The CWC is tasked with implementing strategies and operations once the mission objectives have been defined by higher command. Responsibilities such as implementing countermeasures and coordinating tactical actions are directly within the CWC's operational mandate as they pertain to executing assigned tasks effectively. Resource management during operations is also a critical aspect, as the CWC must ensure that forces and resources are available and deployed efficiently to meet the established goals. In contrast, establishing mission objectives involves strategic planning at a level that is typically above the operational execution role of the CWC. This task is generally aligned with the broader strategic leadership that defines the overall direction and goals for military operations.
