This approach aligns with the safety protocols generally encouraged in woodworking and industrial environments.

Its main areas of focus include food safety, which involves regulating food products to prevent contamination and ensure safety for consumption; drug regulation, which involves approving and monitoring medications to ensure they are safe and effective for patients; and product quality control, which includes overseeing the manufacturing processes of food and drugs to maintain high standards of quality. Workplace safety is typically overseen by different agencies, such as the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), which is dedicated to ensuring safe and healthy working conditions for employees. This distinction clarifies that while the FDA focuses on consumer goods and their safety, workplace safety falls outside its main responsibilities, making it the correct answer in this context.
