Helium is the second most abundant element but makes up only about 25% of the elemental mass, while carbon and oxygen are much less prevalent in comparison, primarily found in specific contexts such as within stars and planets.

This helps illustrate the geographical distribution of the Great Lakes and the significance of international borders in defining the areas attributed to Canada and the U.S.
