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## **Explanations**

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### 1. In what year did Canada become a country?

- A. 1776

Canada became a country on July 1, 1867, when the British North America Act (now known as the Constitution Act, 1867) came into effect, uniting the three separate colonies of the Province of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick into a single Dominion within the British Empire called Canada. This act laid the foundation for Canada's parliamentary system and established its federal structure, marking a significant milestone in the country's evolution from a British colony to an independent nation. The other years listed are significant in their own rights but do not represent the date of Canada's confederation. For instance, 1776 is notable for the American Declaration of Independence, and while it marked the start of a significant shift in the North American landscape, it is unrelated to Canada's formation. The year 1905 is when Alberta and Saskatchewan were established as provinces, which occurred after Canada had already become a country. Lastly, 1931 is when the Statute of Westminster was enacted, providing full legislative independence to Canada from Britain, but this happened long after Canada had already been formed as a nation. Collectively, these aspects highlight the importance of 1867 as the correct answer, as it signifies the birth of Canada as a unified nation.

Therefore, "Paycheck" is the correct answer as it directly aligns with both the year and the actor in question.

## 8. What important natural resource is Canada the largest producer of?

The correct answer highlights that Canada is the largest producer of maple syrup in the world, primarily due to its vast number of sugar maple trees and the ideal climate for tapping this resource. The province of Quebec alone produces a significant majority of the global supply, leveraging both traditional methods and modern techniques in syrup production. This status makes Canada synonymous with maple syrup, both in terms of volume and quality, showcasing a uniquely Canadian agricultural product that is both culturally significant and economically valuable. Other options, such as gold, timber, and pulp, while important to the Canadian economy, do not reflect the singularity and prominence of Canada's position in the global maple syrup market. Gold is mined extensively in the country, but it competes with other global producers. Similarly, Canada is a major player in timber and pulp production, but these resources are harvested in many countries. Maple syrup production, however, is distinctive to Canada, making it the most fitting choice for the question regarding the primary natural resource.

## 9. Which is the correct equation to find the length of the hypotenuse of a right triangle?

- A.  $a^2 + b^2 = c^2$

The equation  $a^2 + b^2 = c^2$  is known as the Pythagorean theorem, which applies specifically to right triangles. In any right triangle, the hypotenuse is the longest side, opposite the right angle, and is denoted by  $c$ . The other two sides of the triangle are referred to as  $a$  and  $b$ . This formula states that the square of the length of the hypotenuse ( $c^2$ ) is equal to the sum of the squares of the lengths of the other two sides ( $a^2$  and  $b^2$ ). This relationship allows for the calculation of the hypotenuse when the lengths of the two other sides are known. For instance, if one side measures 3 units and the other side measures 4 units, applying the theorem gives:  $3^2 + 4^2 = c^2 \Rightarrow 9 + 16 = c^2 \Rightarrow 25 = c^2 \Rightarrow c = 5$  units. This clear connection between the sides of a right triangle is crucial in various applications, including geometry, trigonometry, and even certain areas of physics.

## 10. Which famous scientist developed the laws of motion?

*Isaac Newton is renowned for formulating the three fundamental laws of motion, which are foundational principles in classical mechanics. The first law, often referred to as the law of inertia, states that an object at rest will remain at rest, and an object in motion will continue moving in a straight line at a constant speed unless acted upon by an external force. The second law provides a formula to calculate the relationship between force, mass, and acceleration, expressed as  $F=ma$ . The third law asserts that for every action, there is an equal and opposite reaction, highlighting the interplay of forces in different objects. This profound understanding of motion laid the groundwork for future scientific developments and is pivotal in both physics and engineering. Other scientists listed, like Albert Einstein, Robert Hooke, and James Clerk Maxwell, made significant contributions to science, but they focused on different areas, such as relativity, elasticity, and electromagnetism, respectively, rather than the foundational laws of motion that Newton established.*
