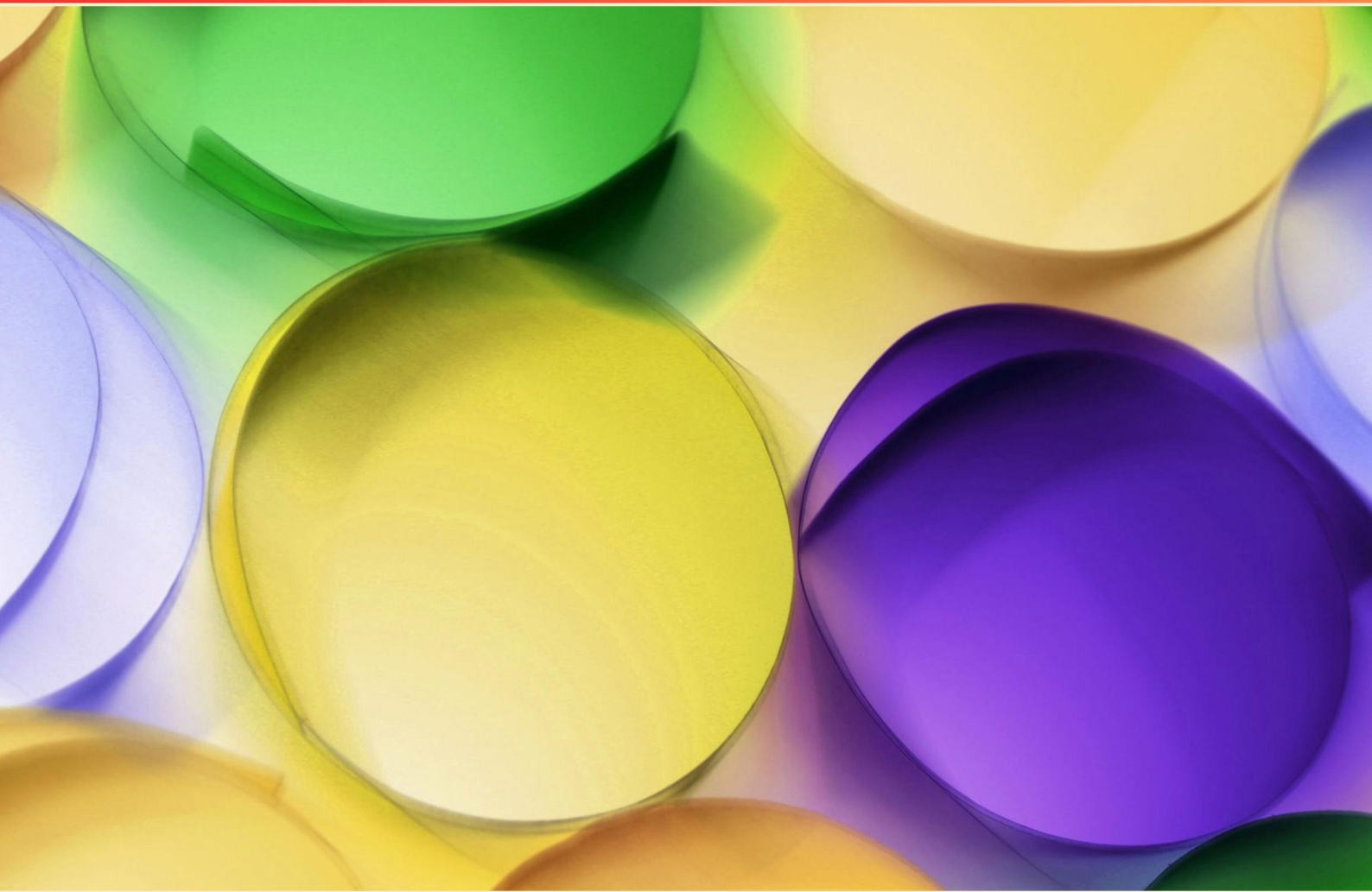

Meanwhile, denying helping her could imply a lack of support rather than involvement in a criminal act. Thus, the focus on robbery emphasizes the severity of the situation and aligns with what might be legally or morally significant in that context.
