1. Which school is located in Buffalo, NY?

Locating schools by city is a common way to identify them. St. Mary's School for the Deaf is the one situated in Buffalo, NY. The Rochester School for the Deaf is in Rochester, NY, which is a different city in the state, and the other two options are associated with locations outside Buffalo as well. So the Buffalo, NY option matches the question.

2. The city of Vancouver corresponds to which state's deaf school?

- A. Delavan, Wisconsin**
- B. Hampton, Virginia**
- C. Casper, Wyoming**
- D. Vancouver, Washington**

Understanding where a state's deaf school is located means matching the city to its state. Vancouver here refers to the city in Washington state—the Washington School for the Deaf sits in Vancouver, Washington. That makes Washington the correct state. The other options point to different cities in Wisconsin, Virginia, and Wyoming, which don't correspond to Vancouver.

3. Which city is the Tennessee School for the Deaf located in?

Knowing the location of the Tennessee School for the Deaf is the key idea. The Tennessee School for the Deaf is located in Knoxville, Tennessee, not in the other listed cities. Knoxville has long served as the campus for the state's school for Deaf students, while Nashville, Chattanooga, and Memphis are major Tennessee cities with other institutions. Therefore, the city is Knoxville.

When you see a campus named after a city, the location is that city. The Maryland School for the Deaf's Columbia campus sits in Columbia, Maryland, a planned community in Howard County. The other options are different Maryland cities and do not host the Columbia campus. So the correct city is Columbia, Maryland.

5. Explain the difference between Deaf and deaf in educational context.

- A. Deaf (capital D) denotes membership in Deaf community and culture; deaf (lowercase) refers to the audiological condition.**

Capital D Deaf denotes membership in the Deaf community and its culture, with sign language and shared experiences at its heart. lowercase deaf refers to the audiological condition of significant hearing loss, regardless of cultural identity. In educational settings this matters because language access and learning approaches arise from how a student identifies. Emphasizing Deaf as a cultural identity supports use of sign language, Deaf-led communication, and community connections, which can improve language development, social belonging, and participation. Treating Deaf as just a medical condition can overlook language access and personal identity. Remember, Deaf is not a language; sign languages like American Sign Language are the languages used within Deaf communities.

6. The Indiana School for the Deaf is located in which city?

- A. Fort Wayne, Indiana**
- B. Evansville, Indiana**

- D. South Bend, Indiana**

The Indiana School for the Deaf is located in Indianapolis. Indianapolis is the state capital, and that's where the ISD campus sits, serving Deaf and hard-of-hearing students from across the state. The other listed cities are in Indiana, but they are not where ISD is located.

7. The Alaska State School for the Deaf is located in which city?

- A. Beverly, Massachusetts**
- B. Anchorage, Alaska**
- C. St Louis, Missouri**
- D. Riverside, California**

The question asks for the city where the Alaska State School for the Deaf is located. Anchorage, Alaska is the correct city. Anchorage is the largest city in the state and serves as the central hub for Alaska's education and services for Deaf students, which is why the state school for the Deaf is based there. The other options are in different states (Massachusetts, Missouri, and California), so they do not match the Alaska location.

8. Which city corresponds to the California School for the Deaf (SoCal)?

This question tests your knowledge of where the SoCal campus of the California School for the Deaf is located. SoCal stands for Southern California, and the California School for the Deaf has a campus in Riverside for that region. Fremont is in Northern California, so it belongs to the NorCal campus. Anchorage and Hartford are outside California (Alaska and Connecticut, respectively). So, Riverside is the correct city.

9. The Beverly School for the Deaf is located in which city?

This question tests recognizing the school's location by its name. The Beverly School for the Deaf is in Beverly, Massachusetts, which matches the city in the school's title. The other cities listed are in different states and are not associated with this school, so they don't fit.

10. Which of the following is the Maryland School for the Deaf's Frederick campus city?

A. Columbia, Maryland

B. Frederick, Maryland

C. Baltimore, Maryland

D. Annapolis, Maryland

This item tests knowing where the Maryland School for the Deaf's Frederick campus is located. The campus that carries the Frederick name is in Frederick, Maryland, which is why Frederick is the correct city. The other options point to different Maryland cities—Columbia, Baltimore, and Annapolis—so they don't match the Frederick campus location. Remember, when a campus is named after a city, that city is typically where the campus sits.
