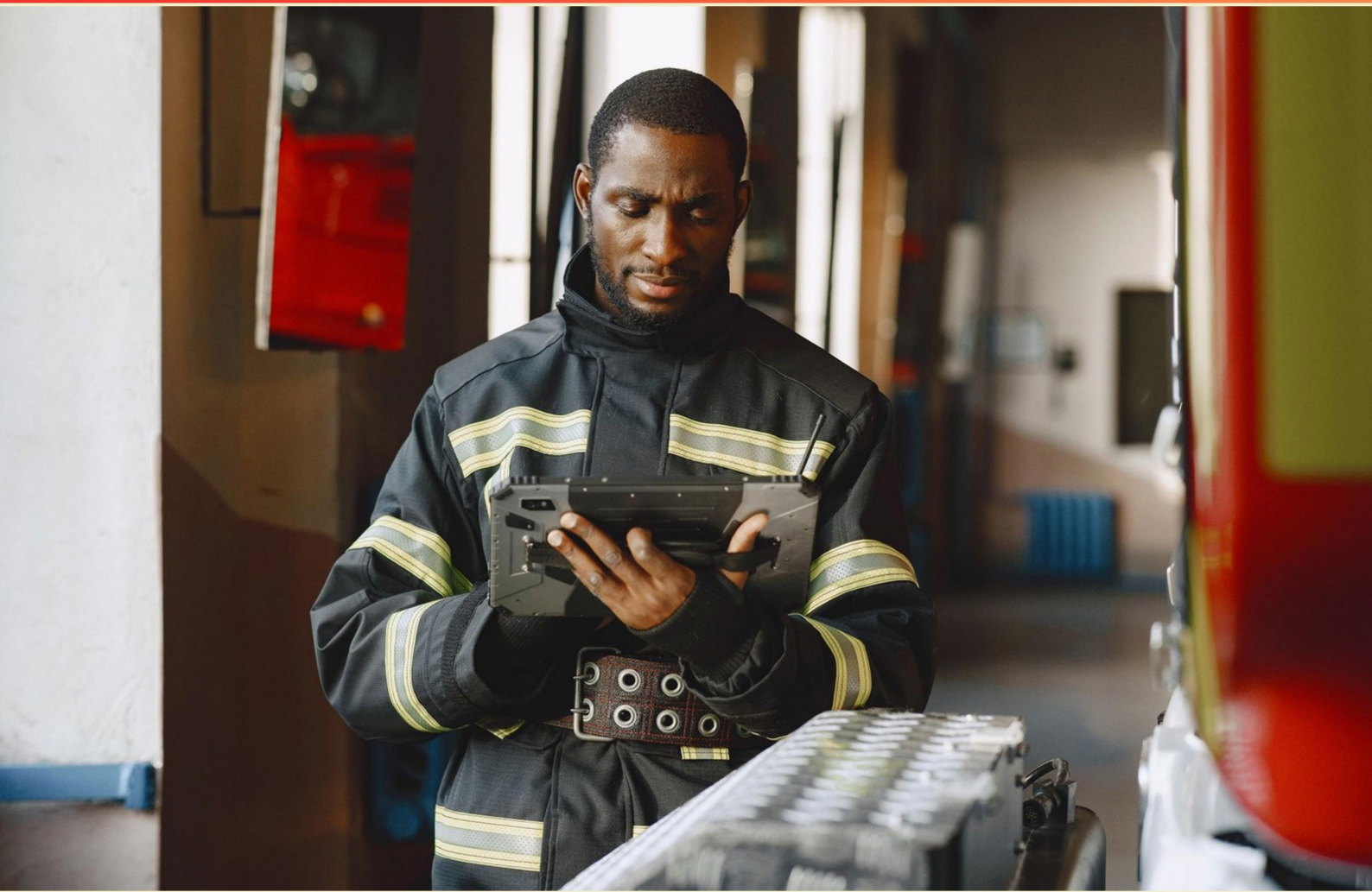

The San Francisco Fire Department was established in 1866. To determine when the 150th anniversary was celebrated, you would add 150 years to that year, resulting in the year 2016. In fact, 2016 minus the establishment year of 1866 gives a sum of 150 years, which is not the choice presented but rather means that 150 years is when the celebration occurs. Thus, the two options that would indicate a timing interval in the choices don't directly answer the question as intended, with A suggesting a misinterpretation in calculating the elapsed time. The correct approach is to consider that the anniversary was celebrated 150 years after the establishment, so the direct question becomes about understanding the timeline rather than simply counting back from the event

3. According to the definition provided, who qualifies as a patient?

The definition of a patient typically encompasses anyone who is requesting medical assistance.
